The following new DVDs from THE ANIMATED STORIES FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT series have been added to the library:



Philippines

The calamities brought about by super typhoon Haiyan/Yolanda last November 8 have caught the whole world's attention. The devastations to life and property resulting to over 6,000 death casualties and thousands still unaccounted for have raised the ageold theological and philosophical question of suffering. We saw corpses in body bags lying along the streets of Palo, next town to Tacloban. Words aren't enough to accurately describe the damage even after two weeks since the storm hit the ground. Being in the middle of it, seeing it firsthand looked, felt and smelled like being in, to use a hyperbole, a God-forsaken place. It was sobering and surreal, to say the least. But we know God does things in harmony with all His other perfect divine attributes. Therefore, His purposes are always good, just, righteous, holy, and sometimes unknown. I think, this "tragedy" would fall under this last category. How assuring are the Godbreathed words of the apostle Paul: "God is faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way of escape, that ye may be able to bear it." I Corinthians 10:13. I am glad He does not have to consult any man before He does His work. In times like these, we are reminded to live not by explanations but by faith in Him and His precious promises.

In God's providence, my wife and I with a church member who speaks the local dialect, were able to arrange our visit to the Vasayan region on November 21, two weeks after the storm hit. So, our goods came when still urgently needed. We arrived in Cebu Thursday morning and got connected to a Christian businessman, a cousin of a pastor friend of mine, who graciously volunteered to drive us around Cebu City - from checking us in for a room; to booking our round trip plane tickets for Tacloban and ferry boat tickets for Ormoc; to taking us to the pharmacy and grocery stores to purchase the medicines, canned good, noodles, bottled water, tents, plus other stuff for basic hygiene. These were communicated to us already via text messaging. Sorting and re-packing ensued that night. November 22, we flew early morning to Tacloban City. We met the Pastor and Mrs. of New Life Baptist Church. We saw people still in survival mode - no food, no water, no electricity.

They told us how they survived the storm surge. From what was left of the airport, we immediately saw devastation everywhere all the way to their church/school facility. He drove us also to Palo where we saw unroofed government buildings. On our way back, we were stranded for four hours at the airport while waiting for our Cebu flight. It was God's way for us to plant he Gospel seed to two men. One was a Metro-Manila Development Authority Chairman, whose office sent some 300 men to carry out cleaning up operations. The other was a Filipino businessman helping out too. He trusted Christ as Savior! Early Saturday morning, November 23, we made our threehour ferry boat ride to Ormoc City where we met the Pastor and his family of Emmanual Baptist Church. We met six other pastors with some of their family members. We rode the ferry boat back to Cebu that Saturday early evening. After having dinner, a brother drove us back to the airport for our flight back to Manila. Photos and videos of these are all posted at the Foundation Baptist Church facebook page at www.foundationbaptistchurch.org.

The Pastor of Ormoc texted on November 25: "Good morning! How are you? We have distributed the goods yesterday after the church service. Thank you so much for your kindness...manifested through your generosity. God bless and more power!" Again on November 28 he texted: "Thanks too for your prayers. Another Pastor got some share of the goods you have given to us...Our people are indeed so happy and thankful."

Another Pastor communicated on December 2: "Thanks, Pastor and Sis Imelda for your recent visit and the gifts you have shared. We are deeply touched and encouraged..."

On behalf of these brethern, we truly thank all who have donated! We pray that God would reciprocate a hundred-fold your kindness and thoughtfulness.

Jondee and Twinkle tying the knot on December 14 was definitely one of the highlights of 2013. He is our only son, the first to get married among our children. Thus, it was quite an event. We are thankful they are both born again believers. Seeing them witnessing for the Lord and serving Him through their music ministry is such a great joy! Furthermore, it was a wonderful opportunity to present the divine design for marriage from Scripture, explain how sin ruined such a promising relationship and, finally, proclaim God's cure through the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Many of the guests have expressed appreciation for the message, most of whom are friends we have had difficulty inviting to church. We praise the Lord for the opportunity to plant the Gospel seed in them. Please pray with us that God would cause His Word to take deep root resulting in their receiving Christ as Savior.

The Resurrection Message

As I was sitting quietly meditating one day, there came to me "A Call to Ponder." Lamentations 1:12 came to mind. "IS IT NOTHING TO YOU, all ye that pass by?"

Christ asks, "Is it nothing to you that I died for your sins, for the sins of the whole world? That, when I was in the Garden of Gethsemane, the agony was so great the blood flowed from my unbroken skin? That I cried out to God, that if it were possible, He would remove the cup? IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU?"

"They took Me to the Judgment Hall; they stripped Me naked; they placed a mocking robe of purple upon Me; they slapped Me; they spit upon Me; smote Me with a rod; they scourged Me until the blood streamed over My broken body; they put a crown of thorns upon My head; placed a cross upon My shoulders and led Me to Calvary. There they nailed My hands and feet to the cross and lifted Me up for ridicule and mockery! IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU?"

" IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU that I hung for six long agonizing hours, that when all the sins of the whole world had been laid upon Me, I cried out in desperation, 'My God, My God why hast Thou forsaken Me?' IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU that He, looking down upon the awful sight, could stand it no longer and closed His eyes upon the awful scene and turned His back. For three dreadful, long, horrible hours I hung there and suffered for YOU. My blood was shed! Full atonement was made! God was satisfied!"

"I did all this so that ALL men might be saved! IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU."

"I was buried, for three days and nights in the grave I lay, waiting for the coming day. The third day I arose from the dead! Death could not hold Me. I arose with a mighty triumph over My foes, a victor from the dark domain, and I'll live forever with My saints to reign. IS THIS NOTHING TO YOU?"

HALLELUJAH! FOR THE CHRIST OF THE CROSS!

Crooked Timbers

Do you consider yourself an evangelist? Jesus does. Spreading the Gospel is the job description of every believer.

How are you doing? Before you quit reading I want you to consider something.

God uses crooked timbers to build His church. He does not leave this job to perfect believers. If He did, it would never get done.

Your probably already have a ministry: You take care of your own family. You help your church family. You watch out for your neighbors. You are building relationships at work. God can and does use you in many circumstances - in spite of your mistakes and weaknesses.

Tracts are crooked timbers too. A tract can never truly reflect the scope of God's love. And yet, nothing goes farther, costs less, or says it better than a Gospel tract. Most people have never read a clear presentation of the Gospel.

If you don't already use tracts, I encourage you to try it for a time.

You eat out. Leave a tract when you leave a tip. Be generous - your behavior can turn people off to the Gospel too.

You pay your bills by mail. You don't know the person who opens the mail, but God does - and He has a plan for that person too. Enclose a tract in every piece of mail you send out.

You encounter people going through hard times. Hand them a tract that speaks about suffering, Are you sending a card? Enclose an appropriate tract.

When the store clerk wishes you a good day, thank her warmly and hand her a tract, wishing her a good day too.

Every time you use a tract you give the Holy Spirit new opportunities to work.

Not sure about using tracts? Try it for a month. Give out one tract a day for 30 days. Add it to your prayer list: "God use me to get this message into the right hands today." At the end of the day, pray: "God I pray that the message I gave out today will accomplish Your will."



















