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Loving His Appearing

Chapter One

As A Matter Of Fact

Heaven's Gate is a cult that believes you can leave the earth by being transported to a spacecraft awaiting you above the earth. Their plan involves calling on Ti and Do, representatives of the "Next Level," who will alert a spacecraft to come to earth and pick you up, at which time you will be able to shed your human body and be transported to the Next Level. In 1997, 39 members of this cult committed suicide, believing that one such spacecraft was waiting for them.

To people of the world, the idea of the rapture of the church may seem just as wacky as the beliefs of Heaven's Gate. The scenario goes like this: At some unknown moment of time, Jesus Christ is going to come to the clouds of the earth's atmosphere. He will have a trumpet blown after which there will be a huge resurrection and glorification of the bodies of believers who have died since the first century. These glorified bodies will be re-occupied by the living persons who have been in heaven since their bodies died. At the same time, the bodies of believers who are living on the earth will be changed into a glorified form. In that same moment of time, all of these resurrected and changed persons will be caught up off the earth to meet Jesus Christ in the air.

You have to admit that it sounds like an amazing story. But if you believe the Bible to be true (which it is) then the rapture is a fact. Jesus Christ is coming again and the rapture will happen as the Bible describes it.

The Fact of Jesus Coming Again

1. Stated

When Jesus ascended into heaven, two men in white apparel spoke to the disciples who were just standing there, looking up, amazed at what they had seen. These two men (obviously angels) said, *Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven* (Acts 1:11).

Jesus' ascension was simple but miraculous. There was no chariot of fire as with Elijah's ascension (2 Kings 2:11-12). Jesus was simply taken up and a cloud received him (Acts 1:9). In other words, Jesus floated up into the air without the assistance of any device or vehicle.

According to the words of the angels, when Jesus comes again for the church He will come in exactly the same way: floating in the air without assistance of device or vehicle. This then will be the manner of the Rapture as described in 1 Thessalonians 4:17. All resurrected and changed believers will float up into the air without the assistance of device or vehicle and meet the Lord Jesus Christ in the air.

2. Promised

Jesus made a promise to come again. In John 14:3 He said, *And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.*

3. Believed

In the Old Testament, there is evidence that the Second Coming of Christ was understood and believed in almost since the beginning of time.

Job believed that there would be a coming of the Redeemer to the earth after the physical resurrection of believers. He said, *For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth: And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God: Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; though my reins be consumed within me.* In other words, Job believed that he would die physically, his body would decay in the earth, his body would then be resurrected and with his own resurrected eyes he would see the Redeemer standing upon the earth.

Going back even further in time, Enoch, the seventh from Adam, testified about the Lord's glorious coming to the earth with ten thousands of His saints (Jude 1:14-21). Jude declares that he said this before the flood.

The New Testament added a new dimension to the return of Christ. Instead of one return of Christ, there will be two. One return is called the Rapture, based on the description of that event in 1

Thessalonians chapter 4, and the other return is called the Second Coming based on the description of that event in passages like Matthew chapter 24 and 2 Thessalonians chapter 1.

It has been believed since the beginning of time that a Savior would come and redeem mankind and that He would come again some time after that. This has been affirmed by the Scriptures both in the Old and the New Testaments.

4. A Desirable Event

There is no doubt that Jesus is coming again. In fact, He is coming again twice. First, He will come as far as the clouds to Rapture the church off of the earth. Then later, He will come to the earth to establish His Messianic kingdom here. The prospect of the Second Coming is a wonderful thing. But for us church age believers, we have to love the fact of His coming first to Rapture us out of this world.

The Desire For It To Happen

Do you love His appearing? The Bible tells us that there is a crown awaiting all those who do so.

2 Timothy 4:8, *Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.*

The word love in this verse is translated from the Greek word agape. Agape is a unique kind of love that consists of giving. We know this because of the context of this word as it is used to describe the love of God and of Jesus Christ.

John 3:16, *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.*

Galatians 2:20, *I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.*

Ephesians 5:2, *And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour.*

This then is the kind of love husbands are directed to have for their wives. Ephesians 5:25 says,

Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it.

Thus, to love Christ's appearing is to give yourself to it. To love Christ's appearing is to be so devoted to it that you desire it to happen, you live in anticipation of it, and you are praying for that moment to come.

1. Are You In a Strait Betwixt Two?

In Philippians 1:23-24, Paul expressed the sentiment that he was *in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better: Nevertheless to abide in the flesh is more needful for you.* It is highly appropriate for us to recognize the necessity for our being here on earth to minister to people and to fulfill God's purpose for us here. What we really need to do though, is learn how to function in that necessity and at the same time to desire to depart. This is a very spiritual dilemma. In fact, it is not very spiritual to be comfortable with our occupation here on earth and not to long for our departure.

2. Are You Living In Anticipation?

Hebrews 9:28 says, *So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.* This is not an indication of a partial rapture. To say that Jesus shall appear the second time unto them that look for Him is rather an indication that looking for His coming again is part of believing in Him. If you truly believe in the true Jesus, then you automatically anticipate His return because that is part of the whole doctrine of Christ in Scripture.

Titus 2:11-13 teaches that *looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ* is part of what we learn from the grace of God that brings us salvation and teaches us to live soberly, righteously, and godly in this present world. Philippians 3:20-21 explains that looking for the Saviour from heaven is connected to the possession of our salvation by which we have our conversation, or citizenship, in heaven.

3. Are You Praying For It To Happen?

In bringing the New Testament to a conclusion, the Holy Spirit wanted the final thought of God's revelation to man to bring attention to the return of Jesus Christ. So He led John to write the following as


the very last words of Scripture ever given: *He which testifieth these things saith, surely I come quickly. Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.* It is very appropriate for every believer in the church age to breathe this prayer regularly. It expresses the anticipation of Christ's coming that should be part of every believer's daily thought life.

Conclusion

It is one thing to believe in the appearing of Jesus Christ. It is another thing to love it. In believing in it, you know it is going to happen. In loving it, you want it to happen – NOW!

Are you ready to leave the earth now? What attachments have you made to the earth that cause you to wish for a delay in Christ's return for you? Colossians 3:1-4 gives us this warning: *If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory.*

We should be like the Old Testament saints who anticipated the first coming of Jesus Christ (Hebrews 11:13-16). They embraced the promises and confessed that they were only strangers on earth. They sought a country, a better country, an heavenly country without looking back.

Love His appearing. It should be the natural thing for a spiritual person to do. 

Chapter Two

Making A Distinction

Prophecy is like a puzzle. There are many pieces. A lot of those pieces by themselves may not make sense. But the whole picture becomes understandable by putting all of the pieces together properly. The key word is "properly." The pieces to the puzzle of Biblical prophecy are found throughout Scripture. If these pieces are not properly put

together, the result can be some very wrong conclusions. Many years ago there was a comic book published with a story about a little girl named Lulu. Lulu's grandmother sent her a birthday present in the mail. Before Lulu was able to open the box, it was dropped and the object inside broke into many pieces. Lulu made a valiant attempt at gluing the pieces back together. When she was finished, she had the general shape of a horse's head. Her grandmother called Lulu on the phone and asked her how she liked her present. Lulu replied that the bust of a horse's head was very nice. She liked it indeed. After a long pause, the grandmother replied, "But I sent you a bust of myself!" Needless to say, Lulu's grandmother did not look like a horse. Lulu had made some very bad mistakes in putting the broken pieces together. This is too often the case with those who study Biblical prophecy. They make some very bad mistakes and arrive at some very wrong conclusions.

In order to love the appearing of Jesus Christ, we need to know what we are talking about. We need to have an accurate understanding of the pieces of the prophetic puzzle given to us in the Bible.

The very first two pieces that must be identified and put in place are the Rapture and the Second Coming. If a Bible student fails to see these two things as distinct events, he will be unable to put the rest of the puzzle together properly.

The Nature of the Rapture

1. The Rapture is a source of comfort.

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 describes the event of the Rapture. It begins with this statement in verse 13, *But I would not have you to be ignorant, brethren, concerning them which are asleep, that ye sorrow not, even as others which have no hope.* Then after describing the event of the Rapture, it concludes with this statement in verse 18: *wherefore comfort one another with these words.* The very thought of the Rapture is to bring comfort, not sorrow, to a believer's heart.

2. The Rapture will be a time of joy and hope.

1 Thessalonians 2:19 asks the question, *For what is our hope, or joy, or crown of rejoicing?* The answer is related to the coming of Jesus Christ. Paul said the Thessalonian believers would be his hope and joy and crown of rejoicing in the presence of Jesus Christ at His coming. When Jesus comes, it will be

such a joyous occasion, in part because of all the people that are there whom we have led to Christ or nurtured in Him.

3. The Rapture will be a time of life and resurrection.

1 Corinthians 15:22-23 indicates that the Rapture is an event of coming alive, not of dying. *In Adam, it says, all die, even so in Christ shall all be made alive. But every man in his own order: Christ the firstfruits; afterward they that are Christ's at his coming.*

4. The Rapture will be a time of praise and reward.

1 Corinthians 4:5 teaches that when Christ comes, every man shall have praise of God. 1 Corinthians 3:14 and 2 Corinthians 5:10, explain that the judgment seat of Christ will be a time of receiving and reward. At this judgment there can be the loss of reward, but there will be no punishment issued for anything that is lost. In fact, even if all reward is lost, the individual is still welcomed into heaven.

5. The Rapture should be a time of confidence.

When believers are raptured into the presence of Christ, each one has the potential of standing confidently in His presence. 1 John 2:28 says, *And now, little children, abide in him; that, when he shall appear, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming.* Any shame experienced in the Rapture will only be because of the loss of reward one should have earned to the glory of the Saviour. The fact is, according to 1 John 3:2, just three verses later, that when Christ shall appear, *we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is.*

The Nature of the Second Coming

1. The Second Coming will be a time of vengeance.

2 Thessalonians 2:7-9 describes the event of the Second Coming. It describes how Jesus will come *in flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.* The result will be a punishment of *everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his power.* How different this is from the description of the Rapture.

2. The Second Coming will be a time of cosmic disturbances.

Matthew 24:29-30 describes the very moment the Second Coming occurs: *Immediately after the tribulation of those days shall the sun be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken: and then shall appear the sign of the son of man in heaven....* The whole thing sounds scary and intimidating, not anything like the comfort and joy promoted by thoughts of the Rapture.

3. The Second Coming will be a time of mourning.

Matthew 24:30 continues with a description of the reaction by the people on the earth as they become aware of the presence of the King of Kings. *And then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn.* While the Rapture will be a glad time for the church, the Second Coming will be a sad time for the unbelieving nations.

4. The Second Coming will be a time of judgment and death.

In the Rapture, the saints are the ones that are caught up and removed from the earth (1 Thessalonians 4:17). In the Second Coming, the unbelievers (represented by tares in Christ's parable) are the ones who are removed (Matthew 13:30). The saints are then gathered, but not removed from the earth. The saints who survive the Tribulation Period will go into the Millennium and live normal human lives here on earth. The unbelievers, or tares, will be judged and punished. Matthew 13:42 describes how they will be cast into a furnace of fire where there will be wailing and gnashing of teeth.

Revelation 19:11-21 describes the descent of Christ from heaven to earth in His Second Coming. It tells of the Beast and the False Prophet being taken and cast into the lake of fire. Then it describes the death of many by the sword of Christ, and the feast on their dead bodies by the birds of prey. Zechariah 14:4-15 describes the moment when Christ sets His feet upon the Mount of Olives in the Second Coming. Following this there will be a time of horrible death when the flesh of men will consume away from them while they stand alive.

Thus the Second Coming will be a frightful time for all who have rejected Christ. There will be a remnant of believers both among the Jews and the

Gentiles who will survive the Tribulation Period. The Second Coming of Christ will be a time of great relief for them. But that relief will be delivered in the package of Christ's vengeance against the ungodly. This is vastly different from the peaceful retrieval of the church from the turmoil of the earth.

Conclusion

The Bible tells the church that we can look for both of these events to happen, the Rapture and the Second Coming. Titus 2:13 says regarding the Rapture, *Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ.* 2 Peter 3:12 says regarding the Second Coming, *Looking for and hasting unto the coming of the day of God, wherein the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat.* The truth is, both of these events can have an impact on our lives as believers now. Thoughts about the Second Coming can make us sober and diligent (2 Peter 3:14). Thoughts about the Rapture can bring hope, confidence, praise and honor (1 Peter 1:3-7).

But the Bible tells the church only to love the Rapture. 2 Timothy 4:8 says, *Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge, shall give me at that day: and not to me only, but unto all them also that love his appearing.* The Rapture is for the church only. It is followed by the judgment seat of Christ at which rewards will be given to each individual member of the church. There will be a special crown given to those who loved His appearing, who gave themselves to the coming of Jesus Christ for His church, who lived every moment of every day longing for that moment when we will be raptured into His presence.

What a wonderful piece of the prophetic puzzle has been give to the church. The singular event of the Rapture is a unique gift to the Body of Christ. It is something to be loved with all of our heart. 📖

We have all enjoyed our new Masters Club program this year. The children are working hard to learn their verses and complete the various activities required to earn the different awards badges, stars, and ribbons.



Each one of the regular attending students in the preschool group earned the first badge "Little Lamb." The students who earned this badge include; Delaney, Donovan, Emma Kaye, Jeremiah, Matthew, and Seth. The second badge to earn is "God Made It All". The Gold Honor Ribbon will be received after learning 3 verses and completing 5 workbook projects about God's Son, Jesus. The students enjoyed watching Mr. Cook trying to prove to them that $13 \times 7 = 28$, when we cautioned our students about the importance of knowing the Word of God so you know whether someone is teaching you the truth. They also learned that just because you reach your hand into a bag of chocolate chip cookies doesn't mean that's what you'll reap out of them. (Not if someone took that same bag and sowed pretzels!)

We are now working on memorizing the rest of Romans 12. We are starting a new series of lessons on Judges and Ruth.

The middle class had art with Mrs. Fetrow this month, where they made collages. They finished their Red Cross health books with Mrs. Smith.

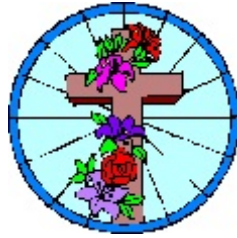


Mrs. Smith also teaches Creative writing to them. This month's class focused on poetry; they wrote stories last month.

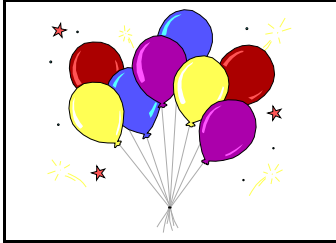
