THE PROMISE

Revelation 3:10

Making a Case For the Pre-tribulation Rapture

Introduction

Understanding the difference between Israel and the church is a key element in understanding the Bible. Distinct promises are made to each. Sometimes those promises are very different and thus easy to distinguish. But sometimes those promises are very similar. Confusion and mis-interpretation of Scripture often occurs when there is a failure to see that similar promises apply separately and distinctly to Israel and the church.

God made a particular promise to the church which is unique to the church and does not apply to Israel at all. Revelation 3:10 says, I also will keep thee from the hour of temptation which shall come upon all the world to try them that dwell upon the earth. God has promised to keep the church from a very specific "hour" of temptation that will come upon the whole world. This is very different from what He promised Israel. In Jeremiah 30:7 God said to Israel, Alas! for that day is great, so that none is like it: it is even the time of Jacob's trouble; but he shall be saved out of it. God promised to keep the church from the hour of temptation, but He promised to save Israel out of it. This means that while Israel will go into the tribulation period and be saved out of it, the church will be kept from it altogether according to the promise of God.

THE HOUR THAT IS COMING UPON ALL THE WORLD

Revelation 3:10 tells us that there is an hour of temptation which shall come upon all the world. According to Strong's Concordance, the Bible word for hour (# 5610 - hora) refers either to 60 minutes as in Luke 23:44, *And it was about the 6th hour and there was darkness over all the earth until the 9th hour,* or it refers to any definite period of time as in Philemon 1:15, *For perhaps he departed from you for a season*

(hour) that thou shouldest receive him for ever.

It is obvious that the prophecy of Revelation 3:10 is not saying that 60 minutes of temptation is coming upon all the world. No where in Scripture is there any such suggestion. It must therefore be saying that a definite period of time of temptation is coming upon all the world. The question is, what is the length of time that this temptation will last. Being a definite period of time, it will have a definite beginning and a definite end and the duration in between is not indefinite but predetermined and precise.

Temptation according to Strong's Concordance (# 3986 - a noun) refers to a trial, a proving, or a test. The same word in its verb form (Strong's # 3985) means to test or to make a trial of. In Revelation 3:10, the word hour is preceded by the definite article. This means "<u>the</u> hour of temptation" will be a very specific and definite period of testing and trials. This will come upon the whole world and not just a portion of it.

Now, consider the contrast between the promises made to Israel and the church. Israel has been promised a definite time or day of trouble. Jeremiah 30:7 says, Alas! For that day is great, so that none is like it: it is even the time of Jacob's trouble. But the church has been promised to be kept out of a definite time of temptation (Revelation 3:10). The only definite time of trouble or temptation that is slated to come upon the whole world corresponds to the 70th week of Daniel (Daniel 9:24-27). The seventieth week of Daniel is slated to be a definite period of time lasting precisely seven years. This is the same as the length of the tribulation period as indicated by language in the book of Revelation defining the second half of this time as 42 months (Revelation 11:2), or 1,260 days (Revelation 12:6). If the seventieth week of Daniel is to last for seven years and the tribulation period of Revelation is to last for seven years (look below for clarification of this point), it is not a stretch to interpret them as being the same thing. If this is the only specific time of world wide trouble that is foretold in Biblical prophecy and this is a time of trouble for Israel, it should not be difficult to understand that what God has promised to keep the church completely out of is the seven year tribulation period which is the 70th week of Daniel.

Now it is true that the church will experience suffering. 1 Peter 3:21 says, For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example that ye should follow in his steps. 1 Thessalonians 3:4 says, We told you before that we should suffer tribulation. The church may even experience chastisement from God. Hebrews 12:5-6 says, Despise not thou the chastening of the LORD.... For whom the Lord loveth he chasteneth and scourgeth every son whom he receiveth.

But it is also true that the church has not been appointed to the wrath. 1 Thessalonians 5:9 explains, For God hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ. This applies to a very specific time of wrath according to 1 Thessalonians 1:10 which says, And to wait for his Son from heaven whom he raised from the dead, even Jesus, which delivered us from *the* wrath to come. The definite article comes before the word "wrath" in this verse indicating this is a specific event of wrath and not just wrath in general. This verse also specifies that this specific event of wrath is not present now but is to come some time in the future. God has promised to deliver the church from this specific event of wrath to come. Considering the connotation of the word delivered, 1 Thessalonians 1:10 is telling us that we are in a present state of already having been rescued out of, or separated from a specific event of wrath that will come but has not yet come.

The particular promise to the church in Revelation 3:10 is not just about being delivered from wrath. It is about being delivered from a definite time for the whole world during which God will test them that dwell on the earth. Revelation 3:10 once again says (with emphasis added), *I also will keep thee from* [out of] **THE HOUR OF TEMPTATION** which shall come upon all the world **TO TRY** them that dwell upon the earth. When 1 Thessalonians 1:10 and Revelation 3:10 are combined it should be abundantly clear that the church will have no part in the seven year tribulation period that will come upon the whole world.

THE DEFINITE TIME OF TEMPTATION

God speaks of a definite time coming in the future which will be seven years in duration. In Daniel 9:24-27 it is the seventieth week of the seventy weeks that are determined upon Israel. (The same word for week, Strong's # 07620, is used in Genesis 29:27-30 where Jacob is told by Laban he must fulfill Rachel's week if he wants to marry her. This passage tells us that Jacob fulfilled her week by serving Laban seven years. It is from evidence like this that we learn the word week in Daniel chapter nine refers to seventy periods of seven years each, for a total of four hundred and ninety years determined upon Israel. The Messiah is cut off between the sixty ninth and the seventieth weeks, leaving seven years yet unfulfilled in this prophecy to Israel.)

The mid-point of this seven year period of time is identified as the abomination that makes desolate. Daniel 9:27 explains that in the <u>midst</u> of the week [Hebrew word for seven] he [the Antichrist] shall cause the sacrifice to cease and for the overspreading of abominations he shall make it desolate (compare Daniel 11:31, 12:11, Matthew 24:15). According to the book of Revelation, Israel will be persecuted following this mid-point for 42 months (Revelation 11:2), or for 1,260 days (Revelation 12:6), or for a time, times, and a half time (Revelation 12:14). Each of these time elements equal three and one half years from the midpoint to the end, verifying that the whole time is seven years.

This definite time of seven years has a definite beginning point. Daniel 9:26 explains that the prince [Antichrist] that shall come...shall confirm the covenant with many for one week [seven]. The event which occasions the making of this covenant is uncertain. But because the covenant is for one week, or seven years, the making of the covenant is clearly the beginning point of the tribulation period.

The temptation of this definite time also has a definite beginning point. John was told to write about three things in Revelation 1:19: The things which thou hast seen (compare Revelation 1:12: And I turned to see...and being turned I saw....), the things which are (compare Revelation chapters 2 and 3 consisting of the letters to the seven churches), and the things which shall be hereafter (compare Revelation 4:1: After this I looked, and behold, a door was opened in heaven: and the first voice which I heard was as it were of a trumpet talking with me; which said, Come up hither, and I will shew thee things which must be hereafter. God is very specific in the organizing of His thoughts in His Word. He specified to John that he was to write about three specific things, namely, what he had seen, what was written to the churches, and what was to be hereafter. He then specified to John that everything from chapter 4 verse one and following would be the substance of what was to happen hereafter. Revelation chapters 4 and 5 set up the event in heaven that initiates the temptation upon them that dwell upon the earth. Revelation 5:2 asks, Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof? Revelation 5:5 answers, The Lion of the tribe of Judah and the Root of David hath prevailed to open the book and to loose the seven seals thereof. Revelation 5:6 describes this Lion as a Lamb as it had

been slain. Revelation 5:7 describes how he came and took the book out of the right hand of him that sat upon the throne. The beginning point the hour of temptation which shall come upon all the world to try them that dwell upon the earth is then recorded in Revelation 6:1. This is when the Lion/Lamb who is worthy to open the seals on the book in heaven actually begins to open the seals of this book.

The seals of this book unleash the temptation which is to come upon all the world to try them that dwell upon the earth. In seal one there is conquering (international conflict) (Revelation 6:1-2). In seal two peace is taken from the earth so that people kill one another (Revelation 6:3-4). In seal three there is famine (Revelation 6:5-6). In seal four there is death to one fourth of the earth's population (Revelation 6:7-8). In seal six there are earthquakes, celestial disturbances, and islands being moved out of their places (Revelation 6:12-13). These are the things that will tempt and try men's souls in the beginning of the tribulation period.

Many will fail the test. In Revelation 6:15-16, kings, great men, rich men, chief captains, mighty men, bondmen, and free men, hide themselves in the dens and in the rocks of the mountains, and will say to the mountains and rocks, *Fall on us, and hide us from the face of him that sitteth on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb.* They recognize that this tribulation is coming from God, but still want to hide from Him.

Many others will pass the test. Seal five explains that many will be martyred for their faith. Revelation 6:9-11 says that souls that will be slain for the word of God and for the testimony they hold.

Why are these martyrs not of the church? First, because the church was promised to be kept from the hour of temptation that would come upon all the world. Second, because there is a distinction between these believers and believers in the church. In Revelation 1:4 John states that he is writing to the seven churches. In Revelation 1:6 he describes how he makes the members of the church to be kings and priests. This is stated again in Revelation 5:9-10. The scene is in heaven and the time is before the seals are opened initiating the temptation on all the world. It is in this setting that this marvelous promise is stated again that the One who redeemed us has made us unto our God kings and priests. Later in the book of Revelation, tribulation martyrs are given a similar promise. The promise is similar but not exactly the same. While in the beginning of Revelation the church

is promised to be kings and priests unto God, in the end of Revelation tribulation martyrs are promised only to be priests. (Revelation 20:4-6).

Why the difference between reigning as kings and priests and reigning just as priests? Because the church obtains the status of royalty as the wife of the King (Revelation 19:7). As the wife of Christ, the church will reign as kings and priests. On the other hand, the tribulation martyrs will reign only as priests. Compare this with the promise given to Israel in Exodus 19:6, And ye shall be unto me a kingdom of priests and an holy nation. Israel was not promised to be a kingdom of kings and priests, only a sovereign realm of priests. The tribulation martyrs and Israel both have the same promise - to reign as priests. This is because the seven year tribulation period is the last week of the 70 sevens decreed upon Israel and so the promise to the tribulation martyrs is the same as the promise to Israel, But both of these promises are different from the promise to the church because the church is not included in this specific period of time.

Conclusion

Those that dwell on the earth in the tribulation will be tested right from the beginning. Some will pass and some will fail. Right now, it is not necessary for anyone to endure that test. If you choose now to believe in Christ, you will be in the church at the time of the rapture which God has promised to keep out of that definite period of time in which He will try all them that dwell upon the earth. For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation (2Corinthians 6:2).

This leads us into several lessons on the deity of Christ and the different ways that John points this out. This line of study is where we will be putting our focus for most of the rest of the year.
