Some of our Juniors will be attending Servant's Heart Camp.


July 13-18

Editor's Note: In the last issue, we began a series of articles on the subject of loving the appearing of the Lord Jesus Christ. The following article is part of that series but is being presented here out of order by request of some who found this material particularly helpful. This article is part of a discussion we have had at North Hills Bible Church regarding the Judgement Seat of Christ, which must be taken into consideration if one is to love His appearing as he ought.

To Judge or Not To Judge

An Examination of Romans Chapter 14

There are two employers: Employer A and Employer B. Employer A owns Company A. Employer B owns Company B. Employer A goes to Company B and starts to tell Company B employees how to do their job. Does Employer A have the right to boss around employees of Company B? No. Employees of company B answer only to Employer B. Employer A has no right to boss around employees of Company B.

Romans 14:4 says, Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? To his own master he standeth or falleth. This questions addresses a problem that can exist among believers – that of judging each other regarding their personal choices. The point of Romans chapter 14 is that each believer is a servant of God and each of God's servants answer directly to Him regarding their personal choices. None of us have the right to judge others because they are God's servants and not our servants.

The Qualifiers

The wording above was chosen with purpose to accurately represent the teaching of Romans chapter 14. We are not to judge fellow believers regarding their *personal choices*. The reason for expressing the content of Romans chapter 14 in this way is because of what we find in the surrounding context. In the Romans chapters 13-16, God mandates several kinds of judgements that are to be made by believers against other professing believers. These must be noted in order to understand the intent of Romans chapter 14.

1. The subject matter of Romans Chapter 14 does not apply to doctrinal matters.

Romans 16:17 says, Now I beseech you brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned; and avoid them.

According to this verse, members of the church have a responsibility to identify people in the church who are teaching things that contradict doctrine which is according to the truth of the Word of God. Such teachings cause divisions and offences within the Body of Christ. Ironically, those who insist upon maintaining the literal teaching of the Word of God are often accused of causing division in the church by their intolerance for other points of view. Yet here the Scripture clearly says that those who present alternative teachings are the ones who are causing division. Those who hold fast the sound words of the truth are to identify those who are teaching false doctrine. This requires believers to make a judgement. They are to mark (publically identify) the divisive teachers and they are to avoid (separate and not fellowship with) them.

2. The subject matter of Romans Chapter 14 does not apply to legal or ethical violations.

Romans 13:1-7 says, Let every soul be subject unto the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. Whosoever therefore resisteth the power, resisteth the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Wilt thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shalt have praise of the same: For he is the minister of God to thee for good. But if thou do that which is evil. be afraid: for he beareth not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that doeth evil. Wherefore ye must needs be subject, not only for wrath, but also for conscience sake. For for this cause pay ye tribute also: for they are God's ministers, attending continually upon this very thing. Render therefore to all their dues: tribute to whom tribute is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honour to whom honour.

Civil governments have been designated by God as the enforcers of the law. The church must not be a safe haven for those who violate the law or conduct their business affairs in unethical ways. Violations of the laws of God are grievous to God and we who profess to be His servants must cooperate with the civil authorities in rooting out those who are guilty. To insure that the testimony of the church remain pure, it is necessary for believers to make

judgments about the legal and ethical practices of other believers.

3. The subject matter of Romans Chapter 14 does not apply to moral failures.

Romans 13:11-14 says, And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed. The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armour of light. Let us walk honestly, as in the day; not in rioting and drunkenness, not in chambering and wantonness, not in strife and envying. But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof.

In statements like this, the church has been granted authority to identify moral failures among believers. In other places, the church is specifically instructed to exercise discipline in such matters. For example in 1 Corinthians chapter 5, a man and a woman who are in the church are identified as being guilty of fornication (verse 1). Paul is very definite about the matter of judging these individuals when he says in verse 3, For I verily, as absent in body, but present in spirit, have judged already, as though I were present, concerning him that hath so done this deed. The church is instructed that the guilty parties are to be taken away from among you (verse 2), and to deliver such an one unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that the spirit may be saved in the day of the Lord Jesus, (verse 5). Furthermore, they are not to company with fornicators (verse 9), and they are not to keep company, if any man that is called a brother be a fornicator, or covetous, or an idolater, or a railer, or a drunkard, or an extortioner; with such an one no not to eat, (verse 11). In fact, the Holy Spirit admonishes them that they are to judge those within the Body of Christ. For what have I to do to judge them also that are without? Do not ye judge them that are within? But them that are without God judgeth. Therefore put away from among yourselves that wicked person (verses 12-13).

4. The subject matter of Romans Chapter 14 is not the same as 1 Corinthians Chapters 8 and 10.

In 1 Corinthians 8:4 the subject matter regarding things being eaten relates to meats offered in sacrifice to idols. In 1 Corinthians 10:28, the subject matter also relates to that which has been offered in sacrifice to idols. 1 Corinthians chapters 8 and 10 must be interpreted in light of Acts chapter 15. After the deliberation of a church counsel, a letter was written to the church which defined some important principles including the matter regarding eating things offered in sacrifice to idols. The letter specifies that these directives to the church seemed good and necessary to the Holy Spirit. This letter said in part, For it seemed good to the Holy Ghost and to us, to lay upon you no greater burden than these necessary things: That

ye abstain from meats offered to idols, and from blood, and from things strangled, and from fornication: from which if ye keep yourselves, ye shall do well (Acts 15:28-29). From this statement, a case can be made regarding the teaching of 1 Corinthians chapters 8 and 10 that the so called strong brethren who think they can eat meat offered in sacrifice to idols without being effected spiritually are in error and need to rethink their motive for eating such meat. But in Romans chapter 14, neither the word idol nor the word sacrifice are used. This chapter does not address the matter of eating meat offered in sacrifice to idols. The subject matter of this chapter is something else entirely.

The Subject Matter of Romans Chapter 14

1. The Issue of Diet

According to verse 2, the controversy is between those who believe they may eat all things and those who have decided to eat only herbs. There is a Biblical case to be made for a diet that includes all things edible. In Genesis 9:3, God opened the diet of mankind to every moving thing that liveth along with the green herb. Later, restrictions were made to that diet in the Mosaic law where God made a difference between clean and unclean animals (Leviticus 11). In the New Testament, God lifted those restrictions for the church. In Acts 10:9-18, Peter had a vision in which God encouraged him to eat unclean animals. Peter resisted, but a voice said, What God hath cleansed, that call not thou common (verse 15). It is true that God was using this as an illustration so that Peter would be willing to present the Gospel to Gentiles. But Peter evidently understood this to mean more than just the preaching of the Gospel, for in Galatians 2:12 he is said to be eating with the Gentiles. Paul makes this matter even more clear in 1 Timothy 4:3-5 where he speaks against those who commanded to abstain from meats, which God hath created to be received with thanksgiving of them which believe and know the truth. He then adds, For every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving: for it is sanctified by the word of God and prayer.

But there can also be a Biblical case made for sticking to a vegetarian diet. Such a matter was a subject of discussion in the first century A.D. The Essenes, a Jewish sect which was active at the time and which were responsible for what eventually became known as the Dead Sea Scrolls, promoted a vegetarian diet. This was man's original diet mandated by God (Genesis 1:29-30). It is possible that this will be the diet of all people on earth in the millennium. For example, according to Isaiah 65:25, lions will no longer be carnivorous in the Millennium. If there are no more predator or carnivorous animals, it may also be that man's diet is reverted to that of Adam and Eve. This was also the diet of choice for Daniel and his friends when they were taken to Babylon. In Daniel 1:12, they voluntarily ate only pulse and water, and yet their health was superior to those who ate of the best of the king's food.

Please note that according to Romans 14:6 both of these diets are maintained unto the Lord. He that eateth, eateth to the Lord, for he giveth God thanks; and he that eatheth not, to the Lord he eateth not, and giveth God thanks. Each of these diets are used by conviction on the part of those who use them.

2. The Issue of Esteeming One Day Above Another

According to verse 5, diet is not the only issue related to this matter of judging the personal choices of fellow believers. This verse says, One man esteemeth one day above another: another esteemeth every day alike. Let every man be fully persuaded in his own mind. Again, both conduct themselves unto the Lord. The beginning of verse 6 says, He that regardeth the day, regardeth it unto the Lord; and he that regardeth not the day, to the Lord he doth not regard it.

One present day application to this issue might be the matter of working on Sunday. Some Christians absolutely refuse to work on Sunday because to them Sunday is just as significant as the Sabbath Day was to Israel. Others work on Sunday as any other day and never think about it.

The Guiding Principles

1. None of us lives unto ourselves.

Verses 7-8 says, For none of us liveth to himself, and no man dieth to himself. For whether we live, we live unto the Lord; and whether we die, we die unto the Lord: whether we live therefore, or die, we are the Lord's. In other words, none of us are totally isolated and private. Everything we do in living and dying we do under God's observation.

All of this will be brought to account at the judgment seat of Christ, and so we have no right to interject our opinions into those personal matters that will be dealt with at the judgement seat of Christ. This is why verse 10 says, but why dost thou judge thy brother? Or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? For we shall all stand before the judgement seat of Christ.

Now keep in mind the context of Romans chapter 14. It addresses two specific issues, the matter of choice of diet between eating meat and being vegetarian (not including the spiritual issue of eating things offered to idols), and the matter of esteeming or not esteeming particular days unto the Lord. God is saying in this chapter that there are personal choices that we may make in these particular matters that are entirely personal. He will deal with these matters directly when we stand before the judgement seat of Christ. So these kinds of personal choices are off limits in the context of church discipline.

2. Jesus Christ has earned the right to be the judge.

According to verse 9, Jesus died, rose, and revived in order that He might be Lord both of the dead and living. Who else had earned this right? None of us to be sure, so we must leave this role to Him.

3. Everyone of us will give account of himself to Christ.

Verse 12 says, So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God. We do not give account to each other regarding our personal choices. This account is given directly to God.

The Criteria for Christ's Judgment of Our Personal Choices

1. Did we make our personal choices on the basis of our faith in Christ?

Verse 22 says, Hast thou faith? Have it to thyself before God. Happy is he that condemneth not himself in that thing which he alloweth. If you make your personal choices because of your faith in God, believing that this is the right thing to do, then you will have a clear conscience before Him. But verse 23

says, And he that doubteth is damned if he eat, because he eateth not of faith: for whatsoever is not of faith is sin. If you are not confident that this thing is pleasing to God and you choose to do it anyway, then your lack of faith will be a matter of consideration at the judgement seat of Christ.

2. Did we press fellow believers to violate their conscience?

Verse 1 says that we are to receive him that is weak in matters of faith. Verse 4 says that none of us has the right to judge another servant of Christ. Verse 10 admonishes us to beware how we treat other believers in light of the judgement seat of Christ. Then verse 13 says, Let us not therefore judge one another any more: but judge this rather, that no man put a stumblingblock or an occasion to fall in his brother's way. In other words, none of us are to be the cause of another believer violating his own conscience. We should never say to someone who by conviction is a vegetarian, "Oh, come on. Eat this meat!" We should never say to someone who by conviction chooses not to work on Sunday, "Oh, come on. Work on Sunday."

Consider what verse 14 says. I know and am persuaded by the Lord Jesus, that there is nothing unclean of itself: **but** to him that esteemeth any thing to be unclean, to him it is unclean. Many things are clean and acceptable to God. But if someone in his personal choices has decided by faith to consider one of these clean things to be unclean, no other believer should encourage him to violate his own conscience regarding that personal choice.

There are things, of course, that are unclean and we are admonished to leave them untouched. Corinthians 6:17 says, Wherefore come out from among them and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing. When Romans 14:14 says that the Lord Jesus persuades us that nothing is unclean of itself, it must be understood in the context of the two issues being address by the chapter, diet and the esteeming of days. Verse 15 refers to meat, verse 17 to meat and drink, verse 20 to meat, verse 21 to eating flesh and drinking wine, and verse 23 to eating. This makes it obvious that Jesus' instruction that nothing is unclean of itself is a reference to food and not to everything in this world. When Christ says that nothing is unclean of itself, we must necessarily exclude doctrinal errors, legal or ethical violations, and moral failures all of which are unclean and all of which we must leave untouched or face judgment by our peers as mandated by God in His Word.

3. Did we rudely display our liberties in an offensive manner?

Verses 15-16 says, But if thy brother be grieved with thy meat, now walkest thou not charitably. Destroy not him with thy meat, for whom Christ died. Let not then your good be evil spoken of. God is not as concerned about whether or not a person eats meat as He is about him loving one another in the Body of Christ. For a meat eater

to press the issue of diet with a vegetarian is not a loving action. Christ will bring a believer into account for such an action.

4. Did we have our priorities in order?

Verse 17 says, For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost. And verse 20 says, For meat destroy not the work of God. All things indeed are pure; but it is evil for that man who eateth with offense. When we stand before the judgment seat of Christ, Jesus is not going to ask us if we ate pork chops. He will ask us if we ate them in faith. And he will ask us if we loved our neighbor as ourselves. These spiritual matters are the priorities of life and will be part of the substance of our personal interview with Christ when we stand before Him face to face.

Conclusion

Everyone of us who are in Christ will give an account of himself to the Master (verse 14). Part of that account will be an evaluation of the influence we have had on others, whether we walked charitably before them or destroyed them (verse 15). Part of loving His appearing is looking forward to our personal interview at the judgement seat of Christ and hearing Him say, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant." Doing well includes being our brother's keeper and loving our neighbors as ourselves. This means we refrain from judging others in matters of personal choices when those choices do not involve doctrinal error, legal or ethical violations, or moral failures. This also means that we do not impose upon the conscience of fellow believers by encouraging them to violate their own conscience in matters related to their personal choices. We shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ. Everyone of us shall give account of ourselves to God. He has earned the right to be the Judge. Let Him be the judge regarding the personal choices of the brethren and let us make sure that our priorities are in the right order, seeking righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Ghost rather than fretting over meat and days.

ELDER NOTES

The Elders met on Tuesday April 21 and on Tuesday May 28. During the April meeting, we met jointly with the Trustees for part of the time and discussed ways to say money in our budgetary expenses in light of the failing economy of our country. We praise the Lord, though, that He has been wonderfully providing for us and we look to Him and not to ourselves in order to be wise stewards.

We have received a copy of the Rossvally film produced by our missionary Peter Colon. The Film is entitled *Rossvally, From The Synagogue To The Saviour.* Peter Colon stars as Dr. Rossvally. The film presents a clear gospel message. We will present a premier showing on Saturday evening June 27 at 6:30 PM.

We are recommending an amendment to our church constitution which will make clear and definite our beliefs and conviction concerning several issues that plague our country and our society. Accordingly, this will be presented to the congregation for consideration and a vote at a duly called congregation meeting in the near future. The proposed amendment is as follows.

ARTICLE 16: ISSUES

Section 1: Human Sexuality

- a. We believe that the only legitimate marriage is the joining of one man and one woman (Genesis 2:24; Romans 7:2; 1 Corinthians 7:10; Matthew 19:4-6).
- b. We believe that God has commanded that no intimate sexual activity be engaged in outside of marriage between a man and a woman. We believe that any form of lesbianism, bisexuality, homosexuality. bestiality, incest, fornication, and adultery are sinful perversions of God's gift of sex (Genesis 2:24; Genesis 18:20; Genesis 19:5-7 & 13; Leviticus 18:1-30; Romans 1:26-32; 1 Corinthians 5:13; 6:9; 1 Thessalonians 4:1-8; Hebrews 13:4). Because of the divine command to end such practices, persons engaged in immoral activities shall not be members of this church (1 Corinthians 5:1; 6:9). Any church member who participates in such behaviors will be disciplined according to

the church constitution, Article IV, Section 4.

C. Based on the Biblical belief that homosexuality is a chosen behavior and not an un-chosen state of being (Romans 1:24-27), and based on the Biblical belief that homosexuality is unacceptable to (Leviticus 18:22; Leviticus 20:13; Deuteronomy 23:17; 1 Corinthians 6:9-10; Jude 1:7), no person who professes to be homosexual, or who participates in homosexual activity shall be granted church membership, allowed to participate in the ministries of the church, or be granted the privileges of marriage or ordination. Any church member who professes be homosexual or participates in homosexual behavior will be disciplined according to the church constitution, Article IV, Section 4.


Section 2: Abortion

We believe that the human life begins at conception and the unborn child is a living human being. Abortion constitutes the unjustified and un-excused taking of an unborn human life. Abortion is murder. We reject any teaching that abortion of pregnancy due to rape, incest, birth defects, gender selection, birth or population control, or the mental well being of the mother are acceptable (Job 3:16; Psalm 51:5; Psalm 139:13-16; Isaiah 44:24; Isaiah 49:1, 5; Jeremiah 1:5; Luke 1:44).

Section 3: Creation

We believe the Genesis account of creation is a literal, historical account of the direct, immediate creative acts of God in six literal twenty four hour days, without the involvement of any evolutionary process (Genesis 1:1-2:25; Colossians 1:16; John 1:3-10).

Fifty years ago I accepted the Lord Jesus as my personal Savior in Machias, Maine. I had just moved there. The first day in the new school my classmate, Jann, witnessed to me and the next week she invited me to evangelistic services where a cousin of my cousins was preaching. My mother had always spoken highly of this man so I went to meet him and through him found the Lord.

In my last letter I said there was a beam of hope that Tom would **translate Proverbs** into good Turkish. Praise the Lord with me that he has begun this work. Pray for him, please. He is 85 years old. This means, of course, that when Proverbs is translated it will be a short step to finish the preparation of the *Wellsprings Study* outline of this book.

I am finding good blocks of time to study and translate notes for the II Thessalonians commentary. I'm afraid the time line of this project is still to be measured in years. Please petition the Lord for a competent person to edit the I Thessalonians commentary and other manuscripts.

A group of us were in Emmertsgrund for a special outreach. The weather was just right for a few games outside which drew some children. There were **over 20 kids who listened** very well to a sketch board presentation of salvation through a story about Barabbas. Some believers in Emmertsgrund might be able to assume the responsibility for this class.

I plan to join students in Istanbul who are from a US Bible School. The students will be trying to learn enough Turkish again this year to do at least one children's meeting, maybe more. To the Zulu's in South Africa

A young man from New York was out here to visit us. On day we went to a large primary (elementary) school with 650 students to preach. **He preached the gospel and I interpreted.**

After the service we visited a couple of classes. One of the boys I disciple was in the one class. As he went to the front to sharpen his pencil

he had to pass a desk where the boy reached out and pushed him. What did he do? Of course, he pushed back. We don't have to look far to see the sin nature in mankind. I spoke to Him to be careful about taking revenge. It seems simple at a school boy level, but as they get older it sometimes turns violent. In African culture parents are usually permissive. Children grow up thinking they can have what they want. This creates many problems in society such as: laziness, theft, strife, revenge, greediness, murmuring and complaining to mention a few. Please pray for us to have wisdom in discipling people in our ministry.

Another time I got a call from one of the boys I disciple to say he had been stabbed after school. Could I take him to the hospital? Very few people we minister to have cars, and an ambulance takes a long time to come. I went to the sugar cane farm where he lives and saw that he would probably need stitches. I took him to the hospital where they gave him a shot for tetanus and put a bandage on the wounds. He would have to wait until the evening when a doctor comes in to look at emergency cases. About 8 p.m. the doctor came in and told him to go home and come back the next day. The following day a police report needed to be made. I took John to school to explain the situation to the teacher. She gave us a chance to preach at opening assembly.

After sorting things out with the police I took John to the hospital again. They only put a bandage on and told him to return the next day. In the end they never did give him stitches, but just put bandages on. They told him that every two or three days he needed to miss school to go to the clinic to get the bandages changed. Rather than him missing so much school Karen and I change his bandages every two days. Some of you remember that on our last furlough we asked for antibiotic cream. Well, it is still being put to good use! Thank you to those of you who helped us with this practical area of ministry. Through it all, tracts were given to various people along the way as well as the Lord providing an opportunity to preach the gospel at a school.

A few weeks ago we baptized eight people. We are so glad for their step of obedience and commitment to the Lord.

When we come home on furlough later this year we will need a car for transportation. Please pray that the Lord will supply for this up coming need.

Thanks to all of you who have been praying for this ministry. It was such a joy for us looking at the children's faces as they were listening very attentively to the gospel message! It is our prayer that the Lord will bless them and save them.

Tanisha is graduating this year from Mt. Zion Home School Academy and will be receiving a parent issued diploma. She has been home schooled since 1st grade.





Tanisha loves music and also enjoys spending time with her family and friends at North Hills Bible Church. She was been on the Bible Quiz Team from 7th through 12th grades.




