# THE IMPLICATIONS OF ANCIENT JEWISH WEDDING CUSTOMS ON THE RAPTURE AND THE SECOND COMING

Part 1

#### Introduction

God uses the marriage metaphor in Scripture to illustrate the spiritual relationship between Himself and Israel. Israel is called the "wife" of God in the Old Testament: Jeremiah 3:14, Turn, O backsliding children, saith the LORD; for I am married unto you. Unfortunately, many of the references that call Israel God's wife, speak of her unfaithfulness. For example, Jeremiah 3:20, Surely as a wife treacherously departeth from her husband, so have ye dealt treacherously with me, O house of Israel, saith the LORD.

God also uses the wedding metaphor in Scripture to illustrate the spiritual relationship between His Son and the church. And thus the church is called the Bride of Christ: 2 Corinthians 11:2, For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ. Also, Revelation 21:9 And there came unto me one of the seven angels which had the seven vials full of the seven last plagues, and talked with me, saying, Come hither, I will shew thee the bride, the Lamb's wife.

In the Gospels, Israel is always the friend of the Bridegroom, or the wedding guests – never the Bride. This can be seen in the parables of the Wedding Guests in Matthew 22:1-14 and the 10 Virgins in Matthew 25:1-13. Also, John the Baptist calls himself a friend of the bridegroom. John 3:29 He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled.

In the Gospels, the Bride is never identified. This is because the church had not yet been revealed. But the wedding customs of ancient Israel (not modern day Israel) give us some insight not only into the Spiritual relationship of Christ and the Church but also into the order of events regarding the Rapture and the Second Coming.

There are three phases to an ancient Jewish wedding/marriage.

- 1. The Betrothal
- 2. The Marriage Ceremony
- 3. The Wedding Feast

#### I. THE QADASHIN - THE BETROTHAL

There are 8 parts to the Betrothal

- 1. The Formal Betrothal
- 2. The Cup of Acceptance
- 3. The Bride Price
- 4. The Covenant of Marriage
- 5. Gifts for the Bride
- 6. The Groom's Promise to Prepare A Place
- 7. The Immersion Ritual
- 8. The Waiting Period

## A. The first step in the marriage process was the formal betrothal arrangement.

The following is based on information from the Jewish Encyclopedia.

1. Marriages were arranged in Bible times.

Qadashin means to sanctify to set apart to an exclusive purpose. This term was used to describe the nature of a betrothal between a man and a woman. Several Biblical passages refer to the negotiations requisite for the arranging of a marriage, which were conducted by members of the two families involved, or their deputies, and usually required the consent of the prospective bride (if of age);

- 1. Jacob made a formal agreement to work seven years in order to marry Laban's daughter, Rachel. Genesis 24
- 2. Samson's father went down to Timnath and made formal arrangements for Samson to marry a woman of the Philistines. Judges 14:2-7
- 2. The betrothal was a binding commitment.

When the agreement had been entered into, it was binding upon both the groom and the bride, who were considered as man and wife in all legal and religious aspects, except that of actual cohabitation. The root ("to betroth"), from which the Talmudic abstract ("betrothal") is derived, must be taken in this sense; i.e., to contract an actual though incomplete marriage.

There are Biblical examples in which the betrothed woman is directly designated as "wife". For example, 2 Samuel 3:14, *Deliver me my wife Michal, which I espoused to me*.

In strict accordance with this sense the rabbinical law declares that the betrothal is equivalent to an actual marriage and only to be dissolved by a formal divorce. Consider Matthew 1:19 and Joseph and Mary: Then Joseph her husband

being a just man, and not willing to make her a publick example, was minded to put her away privily.

This corresponds to our security in Christ. Our betrothal to Christ is not a casual relationship that can be dissolved at the whim of the bride. **It is binding.** 

2 Corinthians 11:2, For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused [betrothed] you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ. Compare Romans 8:31-39.

#### 3. The Betrothal Ceremony

#### From the Jewish Encyclopedia (1906)

Betrothal in its legal sense ("erusin") is performed in the following manner: After the ordinary benediction over wine, the person performing the ceremony continues as follows: "Blessed art Thou, O Lord, our God, King of the universe, who hast sanctified us with Thy commandments and given us commandments concerning forbidden connections, and hast forbidden unto us those who are merely betrothed, and permitted unto us those lawfully married to us through 'canopy' ["Chuppah"] and 'betrothal' ["Kiddushin"]. Blessed are Thou, O Lord, who sanctifiest Thy people Israel through Chuppah and Kiddushin," after which the groom hands to the bride a ring or some object of value (not less than a peruah, the smallest current coin), saying, "Be thou betrothed unto me with this ring [or object] in accordance with the laws of Moses and Israel" ("kedat Mosheh we-Yisrael").

#### 4. The church is thus betrothed to Christ.

In arranged marriages, it would not be unusual for the chosen woman to be someone the young man had never met. While many Jews are part of the church, it would come to be that the majority of the body of Christ would be made up of Gentiles – strangers to God's people of old.

#### **B. THE CUP OF ACCEPTANCE**

1. In the Betrothal ceremony, the young man would pour a cup of wine for his intended bride-to-be and wait to see if she drank it.

This cup represented a blood covenant. If she drank it, she was accepting the proposal and they would be betrothed. Even though she was chosen by the young man's father, the bride still had to accept the proposal.

2. This corresponds to the institution of the Lord's supper.

Matthew 26:27-28

27 And he took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all of it;
28 For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for many for the remission of sins.

The disciples would not have understood the concept of the church at this time. The concept of the church was not revealed until the church actually was instituted on the day of Pentecost. However, 1 Corinthians 11:23-26 make it clear that this was intended by Christ to be practiced by the church and was thus instituted for the benefit of the church.

It must also be noted that each individual must personally receive Christ to be part of the Bride of Christ. John 1:12, But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name. Drinking the cup in communion symbolizes your personal acceptance of Christ's invitation to salvation and a betrothal relationship with Him.

#### C. THE MOHAR - THE BRIDE PRICE

1. Upon acceptance of the proposal by the bride, the groom paid a Mohar (04119), or bride-price. In Genesis 34:12, this word is translated "dowry".

It was something of value, usually coins. The bride was very careful with that payment, not to loose the coins. Those coins where placed on a headpiece, part of the bride's garment that she would wear during the betrothal ceremony. The bride then kept these coins as security insurance for herself in case something would happen to the bridegroom and the marriage could not be consummated. The corresponding thing today would be the giving of a diamond ring.

The Bridegroom's garment was adorned to show what the Bride Price had purchased. This illustrates the price of blood that Christ paid to redeem His church.

Revelation 19:13

13 And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his name is called The Word of God.

The adornment of the church illustrates what the Bride price of Christ's blood purchased.

Revelation 19:7-8

7 Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready.

8 And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints.

- 2. This is what Christ has done for the church.
  - a. The Holy Spirit is our primary gift and is the earnest, or down payment, or pledge, of our inheritance.

#### Ephesians 1:13-14

- 13 ....ye were sealed with that holy Spirit of promise,
- 14 Which is the earnest of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of his glory.

#### Ephesians 4:30

30 And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

#### 1 John 4:13

- 13 Hereby know we that we dwell in him, and he in us, because he hath given us of his Spirit.
- b. Spiritual gifts are part of this as well.

#### Ephesians 4:8-11

11 And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers;

#### 1 Corinthians 12:7-10

- 7 But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal.
- 8 For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit;
- 9 To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit;
- 10 To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another divers kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues:

## F. THE CHUPPAH – THE GROOM'S PROMISE TO PREPARE A PLACE

1. After the Betrothal was complete, the bridegroom would make his pledge to prepare a place for the bride.

The Chuppah today is a canopy under which a Jewish couple stands during the wedding ceremony. In ancient times, it was the place the bridegroom prepared for his bride.

#### Psalms 19:5

5 Which is as a bridegroom coming out of

his chamber [chuppah], and rejoiceth as a strong man to run a race.

The bridegroom would say, "I have to go, I'm going to prepare a place for you at my father's house" (the Chuppah or bridal chamber).

2. Jesus made such a promise in John 14:1-3.

#### John 14:1-3

- 1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.
- 2 In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you.
- 3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also.
- a. Jesus was saying this to the disciples just before His crucifixion.
- b. Once again, the disciples did not understand the concept of the church.
- c. We believe it is appropriate to apply this promise to the church, however, because there is a special place that is prepared for the bride of Christ.

#### Revelation 21:1-2, 9-10

- 1 And I saw a new heaven and a new earth: for the first heaven and the first earth were passed away; and there was no more sea.
- 2 And I John saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.
- 9 And there came unto me one of the seven angels which had the seven vials full of the seven last plagues, and talked with me, saying, Come hither, I will shew thee the bride, the Lamb's wife.
- 10 And he carried me away in the spirit to a great and high mountain, and shewed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God.
- 3. No specific time was set for the groom's return for his bride.

She would have to be ready at a moment's notice. And thus, no where in Scripture can you find any indication as to the timing of the Rapture.

#### G. THE MIQVEH - THE IMMERSION RITUAL

1. Prior to the bridegroom coming, the bride would take a ritual bath called a Mikvah (Yiddish for Migveh).

Mikvah was a ritual immersion in "living waters" in a pool called Mayim Chaim (a spring of waters). This symbolized the cleansing and purity of the bride in preparation for the consummation of the marriage. The Hebrew word Miqveh (04723) also means "HOPE".

2. For the church, this corresponds to baptism, water baptism only being a symbol of spiritual baptism into Jesus Christ.

#### Acts 2:38

38 Then Peter said unto them, Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

#### Romans 6:3-5

- 3 Know ye not, that so many of us as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death?
- 4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.
- 5 For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection:

#### 1 Corinthians 12:13

13 For by one Spirit are we all baptized into one body, whether we be Jews or Gentiles, whether we be bond or free; and have been all made to drink into one Spirit.

We submit to the symbolic ritual of water baptism partly to testify of our salvation in Jesus Christ and partly because of our hope in Jesus Christ and in the resurrection He has promised us in our salvation. Thus we are dipped into the water to symbolize our immersion into Jesus Christ and we are brought up out of the water to symbolize our hope in the resurrection.

#### H. THE WAITING PERIOD

While the bridegroom was preparing a place for the bride, the bride had to wait. In ancient times, this might be as much as two years. During this time the bride would prepare herself for the wedding. She

would make blankets and other useful things for her household.

The church is presently in this waiting period.

- 1 Corinthians 1:7
- 7 So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ:
- 1 Thessalonians 1:10
- 10 And to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, even Jesus, which delivered us from the wrath to come.
- 2 Thessalonians 3:5
- 5 And the Lord direct your hearts into the love of God, and into the patient waiting for Christ.

And during our waiting for Christ, we are expected to go through a process of sanctification to prepare ourselves for our marriage to Christ. In 1 Thessalonians chapter 4, this is expressed just before a description of the Rapture is given.

- 1 Thessalonians 4:3-4
- 3 For this is the will of God, even your sanctification, that ye should abstain from fornication:
- 4 That every one of you should know how to possess his vessel in sanctification and honour;

#### Conclusion

In accordance with ancient Jewish wedding customs, particularly as regarding the Betrothal: our marriage to Christ has been arranged. We are in a binding betrothed relationship with Christ. We are in that relationship because we have personally received Christ. Jesus Christ paid the bride price with His blood on the cross of Calvary. He has granted us a new covenant and written His laws of righteousness upon our hearts. He has given us the gift of the Holy Spirit and through the Spirit, many other spiritual gifts. He has gone to heaven to prepare a special place just for us, His bride. We have been immersed into Him and thus cleansed and sanctified by the cleansing power of His blood and we symbolize this with being baptized into water. And we are now in the waiting period, not knowing when He might come to receive us unto Himself, but ready and waiting anxiously for when that special moment will occur.

We survived the trip to the States! Furlough is always a hectic transition. We have to wrap up ministry and household things in South Africa. This time the Lord brought another missionary family to stay in our house and take care of our home for us. A special thank you to the Smith Family.

The Lord raised up a Zulu man and his wife to continue the ministry while we are in the States. In the past I have mentioned a young man named 'Excellent'. Please pray for strength and wisdom for 'Excellent' and his wife 'No' as they carry the ministry forward. (Her full name is Nontobeko, but 'No' for short.)

After wrapping things up in South Africa and landing in the States there are many things to do here as we once again set up a household. I never fully understood Christ promising 100 fold in this life to those who leave family and things to serve Him (Mark 10:29-30), until I became a foreign missionary. Through brothers and sisters in the Lord we have access to houses and lands and family in Christ in many places. Thank you to those of you who have helped us and housed us and taken care of us and those who will yet do so while we are here in the States.

Praise God for the provision of a vehicle. Even though the bank in South Africa refused to give us the money taken from our account, (our bank account in South Africa was hacked and the bank isn't willing to refund all of the money) the Lord provided enough funds for us to get a vehicle. We found an SUV that should serve us well. A special thanks to all who gave to this need.

Pray for our schedule to fill in as we still have openings into September. Pray for the Lord to provide more monthly support for the work in South Africa. Pray also for the Lord to give strength to Excellent and his wife and protect the work in South Africa. And pray for the Lord to open hearts to His truth as the Gospel goes out both here and abroad.

#### **Philippines**

What a joyous privilege to be able to show our love for our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ by serving Him - all made possible because He first loved us (I John 4:19). This fresh and biblical perspective of Calvary certainly motivates us to stay on track, and by His grace, until we finish our course.

I met a new friend who happens to be a lawyer heavily involved in anti-crime activities. He, in turn, introduced me to a pastor active in getting business, religious, and political leaders together. On our second acquaintance he invited me to speak at their Capitol Christian Leadership Breakfast Fellowship on the subject of leadership. While I was initially hesitant, I finally decided to use this as a platform for the Gospel. At the said breakfast, I was introduced to their President, who was a former member of our House of Representatives. She graciously enlightened me that the purpose of their group was to encourage righteous leadership with their theme verse quoted from Proverbs 14:34. 

The first half of the year is spent in learning the material. This year it is the book of James. The second half of the year we add competitions to our schedule. Our teens were very encouraged as they did well in the competitions with other churches.

The competition is challenging and fun, but it is also the goal to be able to put God's Word to use in practical ways in their everyday lives. After each Sunday afternoon competition some of the teens give testimonies in the evening church service. It is a blessing to hear how they have tried to apply the things they are learning in their study. Not only do a few of them give testimonies each time but that same evening they sing in the evening service as a musical special and play choirchimes for the offertory. It makes for a long, exhausting but enjoyable day being saturated in God's Word and then praising Him through music at the end of the day.

The last Saturday in April is the final competition of the year when the teens spend a whole afternoon competing against other teams and are eliminated as they lose. ## HOMESCHOOL NEWS

Led by Dawn Balcom

This February the Beginners class studied the American Revolution. They also made battle drums. This month they will talk about the Founding Fathers a bit more and finish the subject about America's Independence. The children will make their own Declaration of Independence.

The middle class is beginning to apply forestry terminology to identify specific trees in Pennsylvania. They also are using a tree key to identify specimens.

The teen class continues to do Chemistry with Mrs. Cook. Most recently the teens learned the difference between physical and chemical reactions. They did experiments at home, and the results were discussed in class. The students did five experiments: one for each of the five evidences of chemical reactions. For formation of gas the teens made elephant toothpaste which had an odor. For change in color the they used sodium carbonate and phenolphthalein. For production of heat or light the teens split into groups then combined chemicals to determine whether there was an endothermic or exothermic reaction. Lastly they experimented with combined sulfate and sodium to show that two liquids can combine to form a solid.

Mrs. Smith continues to teach gym to the younger classes. Last month she had the children use a sheet square for playing ball and dragging each other.

Mrs. Laura Morrow teaches sign language to the younger classes. In February she taught the middle class signs for things around the house and in different rooms. They were learning to make sentences in sign language. The youngest class is learning common words and reviewing those each month.

Our February field trip day included a visit by our local fire department. They even let the younger children sit in the fire trucks. After they left, we let the children have a day of fun. We had cup cake decorating, crafts, and board games.



## LADIES MISSIONARY PROJECT DAY









Two of our ladies worked on mending some of our worn hymnals and then joined the others in making Wordless Book zipper pulls for our missionaries.




On the tables were the rings for the zipper pulls, the plastic lacing that would be used, and beads arranged in the order they were to be put on to tell the Wordless Book story.
