Loving His Appearing

Chapter Three

The Terms of His Coming

In spelling bees, three things are used in helping the contestants spell a word correctly: the pronunciation of the word, the definition of the word, and the way in which the word is used in a sentence. The last of these, the way in which a word is used in a sentence, is very important when it comes to interpreting the Bible. It is called context.

Context is very important in understanding the meaning of words as God used them in His sentences in Scripture. For example, several terms are used to describe the coming of Jesus Christ. Each of these terms are used to describe some aspect of His first coming, some aspect of His coming for the rapture, and some aspect of His second coming following the tribulation period. Connecting a context to His first coming is rather simple. But the contexts which refer either to the rapture or the second coming are often confused by Bible students. Without carefully observing the context of each of the terms used to describe His coming, one may be easily confused about which event Scripture is speaking. As we examine the definition of each of these terms, and then consider the contexts in which they are used, we will be able to better understand the particulars of and the distinctions between the rapture and the second coming.

Parousia

The first of these terms is the Greek word parousia. It is translated "coming" with the intent of referring to the actual moment of arrival involved in the coming. To establish this meaning of the word, let us look at two non-prophetic contexts in Scripture. The first is 1 Corinthians 16:17 where Paul said, I am glad of the coming [parousia] of Stephanas and Fortunatus and Achaicus: for that which was lacking on your part they have supplied. Please note that in order for these men to supply something to Paul, they must actually be present with Paul and therefore their coming refers to their actual arrival. The second context is 2 Corinthians 7:6 where Paul said, Nevertheless God, that comforteth those that are cast down, comforted us by the coming [parousia] of Titus; and not by his coming [parousia] only, but by the consolation wherewith he was comforted in you, when he told us of your earnest desire, your mourning, your fervent mind toward me; so that I rejoiced the more. Obviously, Titus could not tell Paul anything unless he was with him, therefore his coming must refer to his actual arrival.

1. Christ's Arrival for the Rapture

In 1 Thessalonians 4:15, Scripture refers to the coming [parousia] of the Lord. Verse 17 explains that at the time of this arrival we which are alive and remain shall be caught up [raptured] together with [the dead in Christ who rise first] ... to meet the Lord in the air. This is obviously a reference to the rapture of the church.

In this context, it says that we will be caught up in the clouds where we meet the Lord in the air. The first word "in" indicates a place or location. The second word "in" indicates only a directional context as into, unto, or toward. When it says we will be caught up in the clouds, that is the specific location where we will meet the Lord. When it then says we will meet Him in the air, this clarifies that it is not a cloud that touches the surface of the earth to which we are raptured, but one that is up into the air.

After this arrival, the church will be with the Lord in heaven. 1 Thessalonians 4:17 concludes. and so shall we ever be with the Lord. This goes along with what Jesus talked about in John 14:1-3. There, Jesus talked about preparing us a place "in my Father's house." Then He said, And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. If He is going to prepare a place for us in His Father's house, and then He is going to receive us unto Himself so that we may be where He is, that must mean He will be taking us to His Father's house when He will receive us unto Himself. So, when the Lord descends from heaven (1 Thessalonians 4:16) and we meet the Lord in the clouds up into the air, (verse 17) it must be His plan to take us to His Father's house at that time, the time of the rapture. In Philippians 3:20, we are told that we look for the Savior from heaven, because heaven is our place of conversation (citizenship). Revelation 19:1 and 7 affirm that before the second coming, the church, which is the bride of Christ, is in heaven prepared to be a wife.

2. His Arrival for the Second Coming.

In Matthew 24:3, the disciples asked Jesus what the sign of His coming [parousia] would be.

Jesus explained that there would be cosmic disturbances (verse 29) and then shall appear [phaino - shine, become evident, meet the eyes] the sign of the Son of man in heaven. When this sign becomes visible, all the tribes of the earth shall mourn and they shall see the Son of man coming [erchomai] in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory. Please note that this word coming is not parousia but erchomai. Erchomai does not mean arrival. Rather, it refers to the process of traveling or moving from one place to another. At this moment when the sign of the Son of man appears in heaven, the mourning tribes of the earth will see Christ as He is in route toward earth. Also, the phrase "in the clouds" is not a statement of location as it is in 1 Thessalonians 4:17, but it is a statement of means saying that Christ is coming (moving toward earth) in the midst of or on or upon the clouds.

Christ's actual arrival at the second coming does not occur until He touches the earth at the Mt. of Olives. Zechariah 14:4 affirms that at that time His feet shall stand in that day upon the mount of Olives. which is before Jerusalem on the east. different from the event of the rapture in 1 Thessalonians 4:17 because then Christ's destination to which He arrives is in the clouds up into the air. At the second coming, Christ's destination to which He arrives is on the earth at the Mt. of Olives. The first time the church sees Christ in the rapture is when they meet Him in the clouds up in the air where He is apparently stationary having arrived at His destination. The first time the nations see Christ in the second coming is when He is still in route toward the earth, riding upon the clouds.

After His arrival at the second coming, the unsaved are gathered first. Jesus explains this in the parable of the wheat and tares in Matthew 13:30. He said, in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn. In Matthew 24:31 He describes it in this way, And he [the Son of man - Christ] shall send his angels with a great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other. In Matthew 13:30, both are gathered, the tares first and then the wheat. In Matthew 24:31, only the wheat [the saints] is mentioned as being gathered. So which way is it? Jesus explains further in Matthew 24:37-41:

37 But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

38 For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark,

39 And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

40 Then shall two be in the field; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

41 Two women shall be grinding at the mill; the one shall be taken, and the other left.

As Jesus gives this description of the flood event in the days of Noah, please note who it is that is taken away and who it is that is left. In verses 38 and 39, it is the people that were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, and knew not until the flood came that are taken away. So then, when it comes to verses 40 and 41, the ones taken correspond to those who knew not, the unbelievers of Noah's day. The ones who were left correspond to Noah and his family who when the flood was finished remained on the earth. This matches perfectly with what Jesus described in Matthew 13:30, that the tares would be taken first and then the wheat would be gathered together unto His kingdom on earth.

Thus in the contexts of Christ's arrival, one for the rapture and one for the second coming, we see elements describing two entirely different events. At the rapture, the church is removed from the earth while everyone else remains on the earth. The church meets the Lord in the clouds up in the air where He has arrived to receive them unto Himself so that He can take them to His Father's house where He has prepared a place for them. At the second coming, the whole world will see Jesus moving toward the earth as He rides upon the clouds. Jesus' arrival does not occur until He stands on the earth at the Mt. of Olives. He then directs His angels to gather the unbelievers and cast them out, leaving only believers on the earth to be gathered together unto Him in His kingdom.

Epiphany

The second term is the Greek word from which we get our English word epiphany. It is a compound word consisting of two parts, epi and phany. Sometimes only the second part is used in reference to Christ's appearing and sometimes the compound word is used. It is translated "appearing" with the sense of a presentation, an unveiling, or a showing of

oneself. Jesus will show Himself to believers when He arrives in the cloud for the rapture. He will also show Himself to the world in a particular way at His second coming.

1. Showing Himself at the Rapture

1 John 2:28 gives some instruction to the church with regard to preparing for the appearing (phany) of Christ at His coming (parousia). It says, And now, little children, abide in him; that, when he shall appear [phany], we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming [parousia]. Immediately following this in 1 John 3:2, we are told that it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear [phany], we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. This is obviously a reference to the rapture of the church.

It is this appearing [epiphany] in 2 Timothy 4:8 that we are to love. And this is the glorious appearing [epiphany] in Titus 2:13 that we are to look for. He redeemed us (Titus 2:14), with the intent to glorify our bodies (Romans 8:30) and to give unto us the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Thessalonians 2:14). This will occur at the time of His appearing (epiphany) when He arrives (parousia) for the rapture.

2. Showing Himself at the Second Coming

Christ will also make a showing of Himself when he moves toward the earth upon the clouds and ultimately arrives at the Mt. of Olives. This epiphany will not have anything to do with the glorification of saints, but will be all about the judgment to be cast upon the anti-christ. 2 Thessalonians 2:8-9 makes reference to the anti-christ as that Wicked whose coming is after the working of Satan with all power and signs and lying wonders. Regarding this wicked person, verse 8 says that the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness [epiphany] of his coming [parousia], or the showing of Himself at His arrival. Zechariah 14:4-9 describes the events at the moment of Christ's arrival at the Mt. of Olives in the second coming.

- 4 ...the mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east and toward the west, and there shall be a very great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north, and half of it toward the south.
- 6 And it shall come to pass in that day, that the light shall not be clear, nor dark:
- 7 But it shall be one day which shall be known to the

LORD, not day, nor night: but it shall come to pass, that at evening time it shall be light.

- 8 And it shall be in that day, that living waters shall go out from Jerusalem; half of them toward the former sea, and half of them toward the hinder sea: in summer and in winter shall it be.
- 9 And the LORD shall be king over all the earth: in that day shall there be one LORD, and his name one.

There will be a tremendous epiphany, or display of who Christ is, at His arrival on the Mt. of Olives. The Mt. of Olives will be divided with a valley between the two halves; and a very long day will occur in which it will be impossible to distinguish between day and nigh for at evening time it shall still be light. This latter part goes along with the translation of epiphany in 2 Thessalonians 2:8 with the word brightness.

It will be in this dramatic showing of Himself that Christ will issue the word by the spirit of His mouth to destroy the anti-christ. In Revelation 19:15, Christ is described as having a sharp sword going out of His mouth by which He will smite the nations at His second coming. It is at this time that the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had received the mark of the beast, and them that worshiped his image. And, These both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone (Revelation 19:20).

So, at His arrival for the church, Christ shows Himself to believers <u>in</u> the clouds and when we see Him as He is, we shall be like Him. At His arrival for the second coming at the Mt. of Olives, Christ will show Himself to the anti-christ and consume him with the spirit of His mouth. These are clearly two separate events.

Apocalypse

The third term is the Greek word from which we get our English word apocalypse. When we use this word in English, we generally think of some cataclysmic end time horror story. Actually, the word means a revelation, a revealing, an uncovering and showing or manifesting of something that otherwise could not be seen. It is translated several ways such as coming, manifestation, or revelation. For example, it is used in Galatians 1:11-12 where Paul affirms that he received the gospel by the revelation [apocalypse] of Jesus Christ. Obviously, the gospel was not given to Paul in some cataclysmic end times event, but it was

simply shown or manifested to him personally by Jesus Christ.

1. What Christ Reveals at His Arrival for the Rapture

In 1 Corinthians 1:7, Paul said the church was waiting for the coming [apocalypse] of our Lord Jesus Christ. In that context, he says that Christ will also confirm you unto the end, that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ (verse 8). When it says that Christ confirms us (makes us sure) unto the end, this is an affirmation of our security in Christ. When it says that we may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ, this is a pledge of our glorification.

In Romans 8:19 we are said to be waiting for the manifestation [apocalypse] of the sons of God. In the previous verse 18, there is a reference to our glorification when it says, For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed [apocalypsed] in us. In fact, much of the content of Romans chapter 8 addresses the subject of our glorification as verse 23 says, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our body. And verse 30 says, whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified. All of this is in the context of an apocalypse, albeit not of the Son of God, but of the sons of God.

1 Peter 1:5 makes this same association between an apocalypse and the ultimate deliverance of the church. It says we are *kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation* [compare Romans 8:23, the redemption of our bodies] *ready to be revealed* [apocalypsed] *in the last time.*

The revelation or apocalypse of Jesus Christ at His arrival for the rapture is related to the revealing or apocalypse of the glorification of the church believers. Thus there will be a joint apocalypse at the time of the rapture. Jesus Christ will be apocalypsed unto the church and the church will be apocalypsed in glorification unto Christ.

2. What Christ Reveals at His Arrival for the Second Coming.

2 Thessalonians 1:7-10 is obviously speaking of the second coming as it refers to *flaming fire taking* vengeance on them that know not God and a

punishment with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord. In this context, it makes mention of when the Lord Jesus shall be revealed [apocalypsed] from heaven with his mighty angels. This corresponds to the time when all the tribes of the earth will mourn as they see Christ moving toward them upon the clouds (Matthew 24:30).

Conclusion

While each of these three terms, parousia, epiphany, and apocalypse, are used by Scripture in reference to both the rapture and the second coming, the contexts in which these terms are used clearly show that the rapture and the second coming are two distinct events that cannot happen at the same time. This is one of the pieces to the puzzle that has convinced many Bible students that the rapture happens before the tribulation period and the second coming happens at the end of the tribulation period.

For the church, Christ's arrival presents some great things for us. When He arrives in the clouds up in the air, and we are raptured up to meet Him there, He will show us His glory even as He reveals His glory in us as by the glorification of our bodies. Colossians 3:4 sums it up for us as it says, When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory. That ought to be enough for us to love His appearing.

And I saw, in the base of the box, a hole which my sorrows had fallen out by.


I showed the hole to God, and mused, "I wonder where my sorrows could be?"

With this in mind we started the Fundación Bíblica y Misionera, our Bible Institute and Seminary. It's purpose is to train Christians to serve and reach others. We make an emphasis on Bible, theology, biblical languages and history, plus practical classes on preaching, teaching, children and youth ministry and music. The emphasis of our Bible Institute is spiritual and practical, we want to teach the importance of serving the Lord in the beauty of His holiness. We also organize special intensive courses as well as visits to the historical places of Christianity in order to have a whole view of the history of the church, and through the field trips learn more about our spiritual heritage.

The ministry of the local church through the Bible Institute does not have only the purpose of preparing servants, but also sending them to preach. Through this ministry we pray for and support the missionary work even beyond our frontiers. We pray for and help the work of the Lord in points of South America or other places where the Lord opens the door. Our vision continues as the need of Spain is overwhelming. Word of our ministry efforts to secure and send recycled literature continues to spread by word-of-mouth. Several new regional churches and individuals have donated Sunday School material, devotionals, reference books, and Bibles from their libraries. Praise the Lord for His continued, bountiful provision.

This continuing supply of donated materials has kept our volunteer work groups busy sorting and filling our shelves. We have received large quantities of reference books including several specific books that had been requested by national pastors in the Philippines and Ghana. A family serving in Zambia visited the office and filled cartons with reference books and children's Bible stories and Sunday School material. They will use this material to open lending libraries for other pastors and locals in Zambia.


