Walt is the author of **Winning Over Depression**, with subtitles: Get the Most Out of Life, Control Your Feelings, Conquer Guilt, and Find Peace of Mind. Here are what some Christian leaders say about his book, **Winning Over Depression**.

# Four Eyewitness Accounts Of Heaven

The Bible indicates there are three heavens. When Paul talks about his own personal vision of heaven, he refers to that place as the "third heaven." In 2 Corinthians 12:2 he said, I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven.

The first heaven appears to be the earth's atmosphere. Genesis 1:6-8 describes how God made this part of creation, And God said, Let there be a firmament in the midst of the waters, and let it divide the waters from the waters. And God made the firmament, and divided the waters which were under the firmament from the waters which were above the firmament: and it was so. And God called the firmament Heaven.

There is no specific reference to a "second" heaven, but this would appear to be the universe filled with the stars and planets and other heavenly bodies. Genesis 15:5 says, And he brought him forth abroad, and said. Look now toward heaven, and tell the stars. if thou be able to number them: and he said unto him. So shall thy seed be. There are other references like this throughout Scripture in which the place of the stars is described as heaven. Deuteronomy 4:19 is a verse of warning against worshiping the stars and the planets, but at the same time describes this place as heaven: And lest thou lift up thine eyes unto heaven, and when thou seest the sun, and the moon, and the stars, even all the host of heaven, shouldest be driven to worship them, and serve them, which the LORD thy God hath divided unto all nations under the whole heaven.

The third heaven is the place where God dwells. There are numerous Scriptures which describe heaven in this way. For example, Deuteronomy 26:15 calls heaven God's holy habitation; 1 Kings 8:30 calls heaven God's dwelling place; Job 22:14 says that God walks in the circuit of heaven; Psalm 2:4 says that He sits in the heavens; Psalm 11:4 says that the Lord's throne is in heaven; Psalm 102:19 says that the Lord looks down from the height of His sanctuary, from heaven; and in Matthew 12:50 Jesus declared that the Father is in heaven.

When people talk about going to heaven, it is the third heaven that they have in mind. Besides being the dwelling place of God, what is this heaven like?

#### What is heaven like?

In the Bible, God tells us everything He wants us to know about heaven. The amount of information He gives us is limited, but this is certainly by design. Part of the wonder of heaven is the mystique that results from what we don't know, but are left to wonder about.

Four men have been given the privilege of having a personal glimpse of heaven. Their eye witness accounts recorded in the Bible give us a hint at how glorious a place heaven is.

#### Isaiah's Account

Isaiah chapter six is the record of Isaiah's vision of heaven. He saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up. The Lord had a train, or skirt. Somehow, this train completely filled what Isaiah described as the "temple" of heaven.

Above the throne of the Lord stood the seraphim. How many we don't know from Isaiah, but by the plural use of the word, there was obviously more than one. The Seraphim are described as each having six wings. Two of their wings were used to cover their face, two of their wings were used to cover their feet, and two of their wings were used for flying. The seraphim spoke or sang to one another with the chorus, "Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts: the whole earth is full of his glory."

At first, Isaiah described the place where he was as a temple. Then he described the place as a house with a door framed by posts. The change in terminology demonstrates the difficulty in putting the reality of heaven into human terms. But as Isaiah writes his testimony under the direction of the Holy Spirit (2 Peter 1:19-21), he wants us to understand that there was some kind of enclosed structure which housed the throne room of the LORD, which served as a place where creatures worshiped Him, and was therefore the same as a temple.

As the seraphim cried out in chorus of praise to God, the posts of the door of this temple-house moved. That is, they shook and quivered, staggering as if they were unstable. A smoke filled the entire space. No doubt, this was similar to the pillar of cloud that led the Israelites by day in the wilderness (compare Exodus 13:21). These things indicate how significant was the glory of God in that place. The shaking posts indicate the powerful reverberation of His praise and the cloud indicates the necessity of shielding even heavenly eyes from the brilliance of His glory.

Isaiah was certainly overwhelmed by all of this as he declared in verse 5, ... Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts. Even though Isaiah was a just man, and a commissioned prophet of God, Isaiah was utterly intimidated by the scene, and rightly so, because flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God (1 Corinthians 15:50), and Isaiah found Himself in the very heart of that kingdom, still clothed with flesh and blood.

Isaiah tells us that there is an altar in this heavenly temple-house, on which there are live coals. One of the seraphim took a live coal off this altar with tongs, and holding it in his hand touched Isaiah's lips which effectively purged Isaiah' iniquity. This would be necessary before Isaiah could speak with God, since Isaiah was still in sinful flesh. But once this was done, Isaiah was able to have a conversation with the LORD.

In this conversation, the LORD further commissioned Isaiah to be His prophet to the wayward people of Israel. In such a setting, how could any man refuse the call of God upon his life. This is why Isaiah uttered those famous words, "Here am I; send me."

#### **Ezekiel's Account**

In Ezekiel chapter one, Ezekiel describes much of the same things that Isaiah witnessed. He does not mention the six winged seraphim, but rather describes four four-winged living creatures. His description of the throne and its surroundings adds some interesting details.

Ezekiel gives a very thorough description of these four living creatures, which indicates how significant a role they have in heaven. He says they have the likeness of a man, that is, there is something about them that is very similar to a man. Yet at the same time, they have some features very unlike a man. Every one has four faces, and every one has four wings. Their feet are straight; and the sole of their feet is like the sole of a calf's foot. Their feet sparkle like the color of burnished brass. They have the hands of a man under their wings on their four sides. Their wings are straight, one toward another, but joined. Two of their wings covers one side and two of their wings covers the other side. They do not turn, no matter which direction they go. Yet they are always going straight forward. This is because they each have four faces, one facing in each direction. As Ezekiel looked at the four living creatures, the front face was the face of a man. On the right side was the face of a lion. On the left side was the face of an ox, and on the back was the face of an eagle. Their wings

were stretched upward; two wings of every one were joined one to another, and two covered their bodies. Their appearance was like burning coals of fire, and like the appearance of lamps. The light coming from them went up and down among the living creatures; and the fire was bright, and out of the fire went forth lightning. The living creatures ran and returned as the appearance of a flash of lightning.

Ezekiel then describes the movement of these living creatures as facilitated by some wheel within a wheel mechanism. This wheel within a wheel mechanism is the reason they can change direction without turning. The color of this mechanism is of a beryl, or some yellow hew. The rings of these wheels are so high that they are dreadful; and their rings are full of eyes round about. When the living creatures move, they do so by these wheels. When the living creatures are lifted up, the wheels are also lifted up. The movement of the living creatures and their wheels was in perfect tandem because the spirit of the living creatures is in the wheels. In other words, the wheels are part of the creature and not a separate vehicle. Their wings are also part of their movement. As they move, their wings make a great noise like the noise of great waters, like the voice of the Almighty, like the voice of speech, and like the noise of a great host.

There is a firmament above the heads of the living creatures. The color of the firmament is of the terrible crystal, or a fear inducing span of ice, stretched forth over their heads. When the living creatures stand still and let down their wings, there is a voice that comes from the firmament that is over their heads.

Ezekiel then turns his account to his vision of the throne. He looked above the firmament that was over the heads of these four living creatures and saw the likeness of a throne. The throne was similar in appearance to a sapphire stone, possibly a rich but (John gives emerald as the transparent blue. predominant color over the top of the throne.) Sitting upon the throne was the likeness as the appearance of a man. This is not to say it was a man, or that his appearance was even exactly like a man, but that this is the closest description that Ezekiel and his readers can relate to. The appearance of this person on the throne was rich in color and brilliance. There was the color of amber (a shiny bronze) around about and within the throne. There was the appearance of fire and it had brightness round about. The brightness all about the throne was similar to a rainbow. All of this Ezekiel describes as the glory of the LORD.

Ezekiel's reaction to this vision was exactly the same as Isaiah's. He fell on his face, completely overwhelmed by it all. And then he heard a voice and God spoke directly to him and gave him his orders.

#### Paul's Account

Paul briefly mentions his vision of heaven in 2 Corinthians chapter 12. He expresses hesitancy to talk about it at all because he is so humbled by the experience and he does not want to appear to be boasting.

He calls the place of his vision "paradise." Jesus used this word in Luke 23:43 when he informed the believing thief on the cross where he was going to be with the Savior that very same day. This would have been the same place that Abraham and the Old Testament saints were waiting for Christ to complete the work of redemption so that they could be given passage to heaven. But paradise is also the term Christ uses in His letter to the church of Ephesus to describe the place where the tree of life is located. Paul's use of the word paradise in 2 Corinthians chapter 12 is probably not as a name for heaven, but more likely as a description of what heaven is like. A paradise is a grand preserve, a park that is shady and well watered, a garden that brings pleasure to all that enter. The fact that Jesus said paradise is where the tree of life is located would perfectly support this description of heaven.

The only other thing Paul mentions about his vision of heaven is concerning what he heard there. But even this he won't reveal, describing those things as *unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter*. One can only wonder at the amazing things Paul heard spoken in the presence of the Holy, Holy, Holy God, or by the Holy God Himself.

#### John's Account

### Revelation 4 and 5

John's primary account of heaven is recorded in two chapters, Revelation 4 and 5. His account is somewhat of a combination of those given by Isaiah and Ezekiel. John also sees four creatures, but each creature has only one face, though each of the creatures has a different face. They all have six wings, which suggests these are the seraphim seen by Isaiah rather than the four living creatures seen by Ezekiel. John also sees the throne and gives some interesting details about that. The significance of this particular description of the third heaven is that it is a vision of something that will happen in future in relation to earth and so some details are added that neither Isaiah nor Ezekiel saw.

John saw a throne set in heaven. The One

sitting on the throne looked like (best human explanation) a jasper and a sardine stone. A jasper stone could be any of various colors, including purple, blue, green, brass, or white. In keeping with Ezekiel's account, this is probably a blue jasper. The sardine stone is somewhat of a beige or reddish color. There was apparently some mixture of these tones in the Person sitting on the throne. Round about the throne was an emerald rainbow, no doubt reflecting various shades of green. Out of the throne proceeded lightnings and thunderings and voices.

The throne was sitting on a sea of glass like unto crystal. This would be very similar to the appearance of the firmament above the heads of Ezekiel's four living creatures, clear, yet glistening much like ice on a sunshiny day. In front of the throne were seven lamps of fire which John describes as the seven Spirits of God, an obscure reference and difficult to explain. Nevertheless, these lamp-spirits added to the imposing appearance of the throne of God in this massive room in heaven.

The four beasts John describes each have six wings, just like the seraphim of Isaiah's vision. Each of these beasts has a unique and different appearance: one was like a lion, one was like a calf, one was like a flying eagle and one had the face of a man. These beasts are full of eyes, before, behind, and within. They rest not day and night saying, "Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty, which was, and is, and is to come," giving glory and honor and thanks to Him that sat on the throne, who liveth for ever and ever.

There are also 24 elders present sitting upon seats round about the throne. Each of the elders is clothed in white raiment and has a crown of gold upon his head. Revelation 19:7-8 describes the church, the Bride of Christ, as being adorned in fine white linen which is representative of the righteousness of the saints. These elders appear to be representatives of the church that has been raptured and is now in heaven. The crowns on their heads might indicate the judgement seat of Christ has been completed at this point with each of the church saints having received their rewards. The crowns received at this judgement are not for the glory of the saints, however, but for the glory of Christ, as the 24 elders take off their crowns and lay them at the feet of the One sitting upon the throne. The four beasts join the 24 elders in falling down and worshiping the One sitting upon the throne, singing to Him wonderful words of praise: worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honour and power: for thou hast created all things, and for thy pleasure they are and were created.

John then saw the One sitting upon the throne holding a book in His right Hand. Just when there seemed that no one was able to loose the seals of the book and open it, there appeared a person in the midst of the throne and of those surrounding it that gave the impression of a Lamb as it had been slain, but was obviously very much alive. John gives a very unusual description of this person as having seven horns, and seven eyes which are also the seven Spirits of God sent forth into all the earth. It is a mystery how the seven lamps burning before the throne and the seven eyes of this slain and living Lamb could both be the seven Spirits of God. It is also a mystery as to what these seven Spirits of God are in relationship to the Three-in-One Godhead of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Perhaps we will have to wait until we have our own visit to this marvelous place to understand this detail.

When the slain-living Lamb takes the book with the intention of opening its seals, the four beasts and 24 elders fall down before Him, just as they had fallen down before the One sitting upon the throne, which is a clear indication that the Lamb, who is Jesus Christ, is equal with God the Father. Each of the 24 elders is holding a harp, and golden vial full of odours, which are the prayers of the saints, and they sing to Lamb a hymn of praise: Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.

Then a chorus joins the 24 elders in their song, which includes the four beasts as well as innumerable angels singing together: Worthy is the Lamb that was slain to receive power, and riches, and wisdom, and strength, and honour, and glory, and blessing. The chorus expands even further and it sounds like all of creation is singing together saying: Blessing, and honour, and glory, and power, be unto him that sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb for ever and ever. As the song ends, the four beasts say Amen, and the 24 elders once again fall down and worship the slain-living Lamb who lives for ever and ever.

## Revelation Chapter 7

John gives some additional insight into this marvelous place called heaven in a few other references in Revelation. In chapter 7, he describes the gathering of tribulation saints in there. They gather in a great multitude which no man can number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues. They stand before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed

with white robes, and palms in their hands, singing in a grand chorus: Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb. Then the angels around the throne with the four beasts and the 24 elders join in the worship, singing together: Amen: Blessing, and glory, and wisdom, and thanksgiving, and honour, and power, and might, be unto our God for ever and ever. Amen. One of the 24 elders explains to John that these will remain before the throne, serving God day and night in His temple.

## Revelation Chapter 8

In chapter 8, John tells us about a space of silence in heaven upon the opening of the seventh seal of the book. This must be an eternally momentous occasion, because all previous indications have described a perpetual song of praise surrounding the throne by the seraphim. For them to be silent indicates something uniquely significant is happening. On this occasion, John describes the altar which Isaiah mentioned. This altar in heaven contains fire which has the power to produce voices, and thunderings, and lightnings, and earthquakes on the earth.

Standing by the altar is an angel holding a golden censor. Incense is burning in the censor and smoke is rising from it. This burning incense is combined with the prayers of the saints, which are offered like sacrifices upon the golden altar sitting before the throne, and which are ascending up before God out of the angel's hand. While the casting of the fire from the altar as judgment onto the earth is something that will only happen in the future, it is likely that the offering of the prayers of the saints in this manner is a perpetual scene in heaven.

## Revelation Chapter 11

Unlike the opening of the seventh seal, the sounding of the third trumpet causes heaven to erupt with great voices singing: The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever. The 24 elders then leave their seats and fall before the throne proclaiming: We give thee thanks, O Lord God Almighty, which art, and wast, and art to come; because thou hast taken to thee thy great power, and hast reigned. And the nations were angry, and thy wrath is come, and the time of the dead, that they should be judged, and that thou shouldest give reward unto thy servants the prophets, and to the saints, and them that fear thy name, small and great; and shouldest destroy them which destroy the earth. At

this, the temple of God opens up and John could see the temple of the ark of God's testament. Could this be the missing ark of the covenant, removed from earth and placed in heaven? Or is this the heavenly version which served as a pattern for the earthly version? Likely the latter.

#### Revelation 19

Finally, John describes a scene in heaven just before Christ returns to earth at the end of the tribulation period. Once again a chorus of much people in heaven sings out praise to God: Honour, and power, unto the Lord our God: For true and righteous are his judgments: for he hath judged the great whore, which did corrupt the earth with her fornication, and hath avenged the blood of his servants at her hand. Alleluia. The four beasts and the 24 elders fall down again before the throne and worship God, repeating the chorus, Alleluia. This act of worship on the part of the four beasts and 24 elders must be a regular occurrence in heaven as it is repeated often by John in Revelation.

After this, a voice comes out of the throne, proclaiming that the Bride of Christ, the church, has been made ready for her marriage to the slain-living Lamb: Alleluia: for the Lord God omnipotent reigneth. Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready. She is arrayed in fine linen, clean and white. A proclamation is made inviting guests to the marriage supper: Blessed are they which are called unto the marriage supper of the Lamb — which John is invited to record.

Then amazingly, heaven is opened, and there in plain view is the Lord Jesus Christ sitting upon a white horse. His eyes are a flame of fire and on His head are many crowns. He is clothed in a garment dipped in blood and out of His mouth goes a sharp sword. What an imposing figure He is, as Christ is ready to descend upon the earth and exact His judgement in flaming fire taking vengeance on them that know not God, and that obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Thessalonians 1:8).

Just like the others, John is totally overwhelmed by all that he has seen. He fell down to worship the one who was showing him all these things, but was stopped from doing so. For this was likely the one of the 24 elders that had spoken with him in chapter 7, as he explains to Paul, See thou do it not: I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren that have the testimony of Jesus: worship God: for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.

#### Conclusion

Someone will say, what about Revelation chapters 21 and 22? Those chapters are not actually a description of heaven proper, but more specifically, the New Jerusalem, which a heaven like abode that God prepares as a dwelling place for glorified believers in proximity to earth as Christ reigns there as king. We will consider the New Jerusalem the next time.


Heaven proper, that is the third heaven where God's throne is, is an amazing place as indicated by these eyewitness accounts. It is a place of brilliant color. It is a place filled with resounding songs of praise. It is a place filled with almost indescribable sights. There is a throne, sitting on a glassy sea, adorned with a canopy of an emerald rainbow. The One sitting on the throne can only be described by the amazing colors that emanate from that divine seat. And, heaven is a vast place, where literally untold millions of angels and saints can meet together and rejoice in our God.

The wonder of it all is that one day, we who are in Christ will be there and have our own eyewitness experience of the third heaven. While these accounts recorded by Isaiah, Ezekiel, Paul, and John, are breathtaking enough, they only give a small glimpse of what is it is like. Yet they serve to excite an anticipation of what we will experience when it is our turn to visit that amazing place. And, I am sure that our reaction with be the same as these four men – it will be totally overwhelming, and humbling to be in heaven, and in the presence of the One who sits upon the throne.

Some other changes will be happening also. These will be announced as they take place. # Leonard Smith

My lovely wife of 55 years had Alzheimer's for a good number of years. I want to let you know that my wife, Marie, went to glory on March 18. The funeral was March 24. Born in Johnson City, Tennessee, she was one of 14 children. She went to Grace College in Winona Lake, Indiana where she met a man who became her husband. The first three years of their married life consisted of helping her husband, Len, through seminary and having their first child.

The family then moved to Lima, Peru to begin their missionary service for the Lord. The first term of service was spent in the Peruvian Bible Institute and Evangelical Seminary in Lima where Len taught. Her responsibilities at the Bible Institute were to make up the menus and order the food for the students. She also taught Bible classes at a British boy's school in Lima.

In succeeding terms she helped train Sunday School teachers and Vacation Bible School teachers along with her husband. In the last term in Peru she served as a pastor's wife.

When they could not return to Peru, they moved to New Mexico and started a Spanish speaking church. She again served as a pastor's wife and taught Sunday School classes and also began a ministry at Bible Studies by Mail correcting lessons in English and Spanish. About half the lessons were sent to prisoners, many of whom came to know the Lord.

She is survived by her husband, Leonard D.

Smith, and five children: a son David and wife Debra, a son Dennis and wife Betsy, a daughter Debra Smith, a daughter Diana Echer and husband Jerry, a daughter Dee Flores and husband Moses, nine grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.

Her favorite Scripture was Proverbs 3:5,6 "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct thy paths."

I am now living with our son in Fort Collins, CO, and have started Sunday services again in Loveland where I held services before. Also, I started to go to Severance again to help in the church planting effort where our mission is starting a new church. Both of these places are only ten miles from where I live now.

I have started putting courses in Spanish on the internet. Several courses are presently available online. The URL is <a href="www.sbti.info/www">www.sbti.info/www</a>. The courses available are: El Plan de Dios para las Edades (God's Plan of the Ages), and a Bible Book Study on Mateo (Matthew). Each course is interactive and has six chapters. The courses are available on the internet all over the world. Now missionaries can use them on Spanish speaking fields.

If you have friends who speak Spanish, encourage them to look into studying in Spanish. The courses are free.

# Military Evangelism - Walt Groom Jacksonville, NC

In the past, Walt served in a Rehabilitation Center and Christian Counseling Center. Since 1982 he has served with Military Evangelism, Inc. As an outreach ministry to not only those in the military, but to anyone struggling with depression or fear, he has written two books.

Our methods of evangelism are varied, in an effort to reach people where they can be found and to bring them into closer contact with Christians from our church plants. Currently we are using all of the following:

- Personal evangelism with training of believers through example and through courses.
- Community center outreach
- School homework helps with a local Chinese coworker providing help for primary and secondary students
- Special English courses and English corners to reach secondary students
- Community outreach activities to reach the families of our students
- Good News Club
- Outreach to men through sports activities
- Parent/preschooler art classes

### **Targeted Areas**

Biblical Ministries Worldwide - Hong Kong is involved in church planting in the New Territories region of Hong Kong. There are two church plants that have been started in the New Territories, one in Shatin, Hebron Baptist Church (Roger Perrott pastoring), and the second in Tuen Mun, Faith Baptist Church (Victor Ho pastoring). There are plans to start a third work in the next three years.

#### **Negotiations about Bible College**

A friend put us in contact with a Bible College in the US. The upshot of it all is that it looks like our one week classes and our Bible Institute classes will all become part of that Bible College after one year of validation of all we are doing. If we meet their standards, we will then be able to add one more year of classes and become a four year Bible college with Bachelor's degrees. Through the internet, we plan to include men from all over China in the classes to get their training and degrees. We have the qualified teachers here already and the school in the US is very excited to set up our program like this.

Pray that we get everything in order. This would mean our past students can also get credit for their past classes and finish degrees here with us.

This is something we have been praying for years about, and the Lord has seen fit to answer our requests. We know of at least six students up in China who want to take classes already, along with all our own students here in Hong Kong. So, we are all very excited about the possible avenues of ministry this may provide. They have already okayed us to start classes under this program. We will have to make a few minor changes, but none of them will be hard to do.

Things look very good at this point. We will probably start classes under this program in September. A relative of a good friend may be able to be the Stateside administrator for us and help us run the program, but they seem ready to let us run our program with some minor changes and an additional year of classes.

experiments and observation. This is a challenge and a lot of fun for our children who are more than happy coming every Saturday. Some pastors have expressed their desire to send their own children to this activity. Please pray that the Lord will use us for His glory and that we will be able to see much fruit.

The increase in prices of camps due to the renting of the camp grounds and houses are forcing us to 're-invent' ourselves in order to continue having a ministry among children without their families feeling discouraged because they cannot pay the camps. Therefore this year we will make a greater emphasis on day camps conducted in the building of our church and also would like to do a good Vacation Bible School in the month of September. The following summary gives the H-E-A-R-T of camp. As you read this it might help you to understand why summer camp is a unique ministry that God uses to make an impact on so many campers.

- <u>H</u> The hearing of God's Word. Summer Camp will not be successful without high doses of God's Word. Campers often enjoy hearing a special evangelist/speaker who shares God's Word on their level.
- <u>E</u> <u>E</u>liminate worldly influences. During Summer Camp worldly influences are eliminated. This includes TV, internet, questionable music, and electronic games.
- <u>A</u> Away from home in a new setting. Getting a camper away from home and on a different property intensifies a person's sensitivity. Summer Camp allows them to have a whole week away from home which allows the Word of God to have a greater impact on campers.
- <u>R</u>eflecting upon the Word of God in a Creation context. Psalms 19 says "The heavens declare the glory of God." Campers coming to camp will have time to enjoy God's creation as they are outdoors much of the day.
- <u>T</u> rained staff leading unique organized activities. Summer Camp provides counselors who have a love and desire to see each of their campers grow in their knowledge of God.

Because God has used the camp setting to work in the lives of so many campers, we feel it is worth the sacrifice of giving up our summer to serve at Servant's Heart Camp.

# Pleasant Acres - by Bud Collins

NHBC has had a ministry at Pleasant Acres Nursing Home for many years. Normally we minister six times a year.

Our services consist of hymns for all to sing, Scripture, prayer, special music, some testimonies of our people from NHBC, and a Bible message (usually by people from NHBC). Very few respond to the gospel for salvation, although a number thank us for the good Bible preaching and teaching.

If residents from all five floors were allowed to come each Sunday, the Chapel would exceed the maximum allowed in the room (fire safety requirements), so some Sundays we have residents from two floors, and some Sundays from three floors. Fortunately, the residents not able to attend the Chapel can watch the service in their rooms on closed circuit TV.

Since most residents are in wheelchairs and require assistance, our volunteers wheel them to the Chapel. In addition, a number of the people have difficulty finding the correct page in the hymnal, so our volunteers help them with this as well.

If you would like to serve the Lord by helping the residents get to the service, enjoy the singing, and hear the good news of the Gospel, come and join us six times a year at Pleasant Acres.

# Manor Care - by Don Scotten

North Hills Bible Church has the privilege of holding a Worship service at Manor Care Nursing Home at Kingston Court. These services are held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of every even numbered month. The services start at approximately 2:00 P.M. and last about 45 minutes.

Usually we have someone for special music, and do three songs and have a speaker. We arrive early and help bring the residents to the service, and after the service we help take the residents back to their rooms.

We have approximately 20 residents and

visitors attending the services. Some attending our service are members of mainline denominational churches, and some from Gospel preaching churches, and some have seldom attended church services.

Most of the residents are alert and understand exactly what is being said. They appreciate hearing the Word of God and singing the songs.

Hopefully we give hope, and comfort and courage to all those attending. Also, in a very brief time, we attempt to give the plan of salvation.

NHBC holds a gospel meeting at the Rescue Mission the third Monday of each month. This is a traditional service with singing the hymns of the faith, scripture reading and prayer. Street Meetings - During the summer months a team goes to downtown York to hold street meetings and pass out tracts to those walking the streets.


