RUDIMENTARY PRINCIPLE OF THE WORLD #7 PEACE AND SAFETY IS A GREATER GOOD THAN LIBERTY

Introduction

"When Edward Snowden revealed that the federal government, in direct defiance of the Fourth Amendment to the Constitution, was unlawfully and unconstitutionally spying on all Americans who use telephones, text messaging or emails to communicate with other persons, he opened a Pandora's box of allegations and recriminations. The allegations he unleashed are that Americans have a government that assaults our personal freedoms, operates in secrecy and violates the Constitution and the values upon which it is based. The recriminations [or rebuttal to the allegations] are that safety is a greater good than liberty, and Snowden interfered with the ability of the government to keep us safe by exposing its secrets, and so he should be silenced and punished. In the course of this debate, you have heard the argument that we all need to sacrifice some liberty in order to assure our safety, that liberty and safety are in [counterbalance], and when they clash, it is the government that should balance one against the other and decide which shall prevail. This is, of course, an argument the government loves, as it presupposes that the government has the moral, legal and constitutional power to make this satanic bargain. Roman emperors and tribal chieftains, King George III and French revolutionaries, 20th-century dictators and 21st-century American presidents all have asserted that their first job is to keep us safe, and in doing so, they are somehow entitled to take away our liberties, whether it be the speech they hate or fear, the privacy they capriciously love to invade or the private property and wealth they salaciously covet."

There is a debate in our society about the balance between safety and liberty. Should the Federal government have the right to limit our liberty in order to keep us safe? Is safety a greater good than liberty.

Following 9/11, 2001, polls showed increasing numbers of Americans willing to give up civil liberties in order for us to be safe. Since the disclosure of certain activities of the Federal government, like collecting telephone and email data, the numbers have shifted, and now only about 40% are willing to do so.

But there is something larger than this afoot in our world. The Bible tells us that in the end times, peace and safety will become a priority for the world, just like it has been in times past leading up to some judgment of God being poured out upon the world.

1 Thessalonians 5:3

For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape.

The debate as it exists now between safety and liberty is clouded and confused by what the world considers to be safety and liberty. The legitimate role of government is not really the crucial issue for those of us who order our lives by the Bible. The real issue is – what really is liberty, peace, and safety.

I. WHAT IS LIBERTY, PEACE AND SAFETY TO THE WORLD?

The world defines peace and safety as the liberty to continue an ungodly lifestyle without interruption and without disturbance.

A. God predicted this.

Deuteronomy 29:18-20

18 Lest there should be among you man, or woman, or family, or tribe, whose heart turneth away this day from the LORD our God, to go and serve the gods of these nations; lest there should be among you a root that beareth gall and wormwood;

19 And it come to pass, when he heareth the words of this curse, that he bless himself in his heart, saying, I shall have peace, though I walk in the imagination of mine heart, to add drunkenness to thirst:

20 The LORD will not spare him, but then the anger of the LORD and his jealousy shall smoke against that man, and all the curses that are written in this book shall lie upon him, and the LORD shall blot out his name from under heaven. 21 And the LORD shall separate him unto evil out of all the tribes of Israel, according to all the curses of the covenant that are written in this book of the law:

22 So that the generation to come of your children that shall rise up after you, and the stranger that shall come from a far land, shall say, when they see the plagues of that land, and the sicknesses which the LORD hath laid upon it;

23 And that the whole land thereof is brimstone, and salt, and burning, that it is not sown, nor beareth, nor any grass groweth therein, like the overthrow of Sodom, and Gomorrah, Admah, and Zeboim, which the LORD overthrew in his anger, and in his wrath:

24 Even all nations shall say, Wherefore hath the LORD done thus unto this land? what meaneth the heat of this great anger?

And this is exactly what happened. Just prior to Assyria destroying the northern kingdom of Israel:

Isaiah 56:11-12

11 Yea, they are greedy dogs which can never have enough, and they are shepherds that cannot understand: they all look to their own way, every one for his gain, from his quarter.

12 Come ye, say they, I will fetch wine, and we will

fill ourselves with strong drink; and to morrow shall be as this day, and much more abundant.

- B. This has consistently been practiced in history.
 - 1. In the days of Noah

Matthew 24:37-39

37 But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

38 For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark,

39 And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be.

2. In the days of Sodom and Gomorrah

Luke 17:28-30

28 Likewise also as it was in the days of Lot; they did eat, they drank, they bought, they sold, they planted, they builded;

29 But the same day that Lot went out of Sodom it rained fire and brimstone from heaven, and destroyed them all.

30 Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed.

C. And this is what we can observe in our day as we approach the end times.

"As long as my ungodly lifestyle is undisturbed, nothing else matters."

"Don't tell me anything that will cause me to feel uncomfortable about my actions and my words."

People's lives should not be ruined by sending them to jail because of using or selling marijuana.

Here is another headline:

Why ruin a young nonviolent drug offender's life by sending him to jail?

Posted on March 25, 2013

So here goes the argument:

Let's not legalize it, let's just decriminalize it.

Note

That just does not make sense.

It isn't legal.

But it isn't criminal.

So what is it?

Or, how about this headline:

Throwing Kids In Jail Makes Crime Worse, Ruins Lives

By Zack Beauchamp June 17, 2013 at 2:30 pm

The Bible teaches just the opposite.

Ecclesiastes 8:11

Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil.

The new order in our country is not to enforce laws if those laws are deemed intrusive into people's ability to pursue happiness.

Consider the following:

Regarding Adultery Laws

In the U.S., in the year 2010, people can still be prosecuted for breaching their marital vows. The laws are some of the last remnants of our Puritanical past, where infidelity was treated as not only a marital but also as a criminal matter.

A 1997 poll showed that 35% of Americans believe adultery should be a crime.

[Which means 65% believe adultery is not a crime.]

When the Puritans came to this land, they left a country where the English treated adultery as largely a civil and personal matter. The Puritans wanted to create a society where moral dictates were enforced by harsh corporal punishments.

Nathaniel Hawthorne's The Scarlet Letter accurately portrayed colonial America under such criminal laws enforcing religious values. There was extensive entanglement between church and state, with adulterers punished for their immorality

Civil libertarians have long opposed adultery laws as a version of the "tyranny of the majority" over the values of citizens.

Regarding Immigration Laws

In fact, it is not even politically correct to use the term "illegal immigrant." It is supposedly offensive and does not accurately describe "honest" people who are just coming here to find a good job and provide for their family.

Note

We might have mixed feelings about what to do with millions of illegal immigrants in this country BUT, the point is the reluctance of a nation to enforce laws that disturb a person's peace and safety.

There are many ways we have decided as a society that we do not want to "ruin people's lives."

Don't give children grades Don't keep score in games Don't put people in jail Don't call people sinners

Everyone, they say, according to the constitution of the United States has a right to pursue happiness (except

that is in the Declaration of Independence and not the Constitution). Some politicians get those documents mixed up today.

And, they say, no one has a right to impose their religious or moral values on another person, denying them the peace and safety to pursue happiness in their own way.

- D. Peace and safety to the world is the liberty to live as they please without disturbance from God or man.
 - 1. The world denies God will hold them accountable.

Psalm 10:3-13

- 3 For <u>the wicked boasteth of his heart's</u> <u>desire</u>, and blesseth the covetous, whom the LORD abhorreth.
- 4 The wicked, through the pride of his countenance, will not seek after God: God is not in all his thoughts.
- 6 He hath said in his heart, <u>I shall not be</u> moved: for I shall never be in adversity.
- 11 He hath said in his heart, God hath forgotten: he hideth his face; he will never see it.
- 13 Wherefore doth the wicked contemn God? he hath said in his heart, <u>Thou wilt not</u> require it.
- 2. And they demand the same courtesy from their fellow man.

Let's legalize drugs

Let's legalize adultery

Let's legalize fornication

Let's legalize gay marriage

Let's legalize illegal immigration

Let's legalize women of ill repute

Let's legalize gambling

Let's legalize abortion

Let's legalize euthanasia

Let's legalize discrimination against

Christians

And then we will have peace and safety to liberally pursue our happiness without fear of disturbance or hindrance.

II. THERE IS NO PEACE AND SAFETY FOR THE WICKED.

A. Here is the problem.

Isaiah 48:22

There is no peace, saith the LORD, unto the wicked.

Isaiah 57:21

There is no peace, saith my God, to the wicked.

B. Telling yourself that everything is okay won't help.

Jeremiah 6:10-15

- 10 To whom shall I speak, and give warning, that they may hear? behold, their ear is uncircumcised, and they cannot hearken: behold, the word of the LORD is unto them a reproach; they have no delight in it.
- 11 Therefore I am full of the fury of the LORD; I am weary with holding in: I will pour it out upon the children abroad, and upon the assembly of young men together: for even the husband with the wife shall be taken, the aged with him that is full of days.
- 12 And their houses shall be turned unto others, with their fields and wives together: for I will stretch out my hand upon the inhabitants of the land, saith the LORD.
- 13 For from the least of them even unto the greatest of them every one is given to covetousness; and from the prophet even unto the priest every one dealeth falsely.
- 14 They have healed also the hurt of the daughter of my people slightly, saying, Peace, peace; when there is no peace.
- 15 Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore they shall fall among them that fall: at the time that I visit them they shall be cast down, saith the LORD.

Ezekiel 13:10-16

- 10 Because, even because they have seduced my people, saying, Peace; and there was no peace; and one built up a wall, and, lo, others <u>daubed</u> it with <u>untempered morter</u>: overlay smear white wash plaster covering
- 11 Say unto them which daub it with untempered morter, that it shall fall: there shall be an overflowing shower; and ye, O great hailstones, shall fall; and a stormy wind shall rend it.

- 12 Lo, when the wall is fallen, shall it not be said unto you, Where is the daubing wherewith ye have daubed it?
- 13 Therefore thus saith the Lord GOD; I will even rend it with a stormy wind in my fury; and there shall be an overflowing shower in mine anger, and great hailstones in my fury to consume it.
- 14 So will I break down the wall that ye have daubed with untempered morter, and bring it down to the ground, so that the foundation thereof shall be discovered, and it shall fall, and ye shall be consumed in the midst thereof: and ye shall know that I am the LORD.
- 15 Thus will I accomplish my wrath upon the wall, and upon them that have daubed it with untempered morter, and will say unto you, The wall is no more, neither they that daubed it;
- 16 To wit, the prophets of Israel which prophesy concerning Jerusalem, and which see visions of peace for her, and there is no peace, saith the Lord GOD.

III. REAL LIBERTY CAN ONLY BE FOUND IN CHRIST.

Romans 6:17-23

- 17 But God be thanked, that **ye were the servants of sin**, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered **you**
- 18 **Being then made free from sin**, ye became the servants of righteousness. real liberty
- 19 I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness.

 20 For when ye were the servants of sin **ye were**
- 20 For when ye were the servants of sin, **ye were** free from righteousness.
- 21 What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for the end of those things is death.
- 22 **But now being made free from sin**, and become servants to God, **ye have your fruit unto holiness**, and the end everlasting life.
- 23 For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 8:1-2

1 There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made me free from the law of sin and death.

Galatians 6:1

1 Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage.

IV. REAL PEACE AND REAL SAFETY ONLY EXISTS FOR THOSE WHO TRUST IN CHRIST.

Psalms 4:8

I will both lay me down in **peace**, and sleep: for thou, LORD, only makest me dwell in **safety**.

Proverbs 18:10

The name of the LORD is a strong tower: the righteous runneth into it, and is **safe**.

Proverbs 21:31

The horse is prepared against the day of battle: but safety is of the LORD.

Proverbs 29:25

The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be **safe**.

Romans 5:1

Therefore being justified by faith, we have **peace** with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

Philippians 4:7

And the **peace of God**, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Hebrews 6:19

Which hope we have as an anchor of the soul, both **sure and stedfast**, and which entereth into that within the veil:

Ephesians 1:13

In whom ye also trusted, after that ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation: in whom also after that ye believed, ye were **sealed with that holy Spirit of promise**,

2 Timothy 2:19

Nevertheless the foundation of God standeth sure, having this seal, The Lord knoweth them that are his.

Psalms 18:2

The LORD is my rock, and my fortress, and my deliverer; my God, my strength, in whom I will trust; my buckler, and the horn of my salvation, and my high tower.

Psalms 118:6

The LORD is on my side; I will not fear: what can man do unto me?

Romans 8:31-39

- 31 What shall we then say to these things? **If God be for us, who can be against us?**
- 32 He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?

- 34 Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.
- 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword?
- 36 As it is written, For thy sake we are killed all the day long; we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.
- 37 Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.
- 38 For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come,
- 39 Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Conclusion

Romans 6:20

For when ye were the servants of sin, ye were free from righteousness.

The world is free from righteousness and so they think they are free indeed, not knowing they are servants of sin. To the world, peace and safety guarantees their freedom from righteousness and guarantees their freedom to continue to be servants of sin. And they do not know that the flood waters of the judgement of God will come upon them suddenly. How deceived the world is. But we can see it coming. And we know that the only real liberty, the only real peace, and the only real safety can be found in Jesus Christ. I guess we need to tell somebody, if they will listen.


