The European Union and the Supra-Religion

Dr. Congdon presents a compelling case that the European Union may be the embryo of the restored Roman Empire whose revival as a world power was prophesied by Daniel over 2500 years ago. Inspired and used by Satan, this empire will be "diverse" and unique in history, uniting a supra-government with a worldwide supra-religion, and in an attempt to thwart Christ's return to claim His kingdom, will persecute and nearly destroy Israel.

An Appointment with God

How Can We Overcome Death?

Mankind thinks its biggest problem is death. Indeed, death is something that men have not been able to overcome even though they have tried relentlessly. They have tried searching for a fountain of youth. They have tried deifying themselves in a variety of religions. They have pursued scientific and medical resolutions to life threatening health problems. And, they have frozen the dying bodies of some people, with the hope that they may be revived when medical solutions are developed for their cause of death. Unfortunately, none of these things has worked.

Death is not the result of disease, injury, age, or any other physical circumstance; death is solely the result of sin. The Bible makes this very clear in Romans 5:12: Wherefore, as by one man sin entered into the world, and <u>death by sin</u>; and so death passed upon all men, for that all have sinned. Death came into being because of sin. Therefore, death is not the root of the problem, it is only a result of what is really man's biggest problem – sin!

In order to conquer death, the problem of sin must be resolved first; and sin is another matter that men cannot overcome themselves. The Bible says that the wages of sin is death (Romans 6:23). In other words, the only reward man will ever get from his sin is death. And since all have sinned (Romans 3:23), everyone will die. The Bible also teaches that as long as man tries to overcome death through his own efforts, he only adds to his problem and makes things worse: Now to him that worketh is the reward not reckoned of grace, but of debt (Romans 4:4). For a lost sinner, good works only add to the certainty of his dying, because every good work done by a man with the hope that he will earn the right to live by his own goodness denies the truth of the gospel and is in effect an act of selfishness and rejection of the grace of God.

Only God is able to resolve the problem of death for mankind, because only God is able to resolve the problem of sin. And God's resolution for sin is not simply to give men life. Rather, God gives men the thing that produces life, so that the gift they enjoy from Him is so much more than just the extension of their existence; it is, indeed, eternal and abundant life.

The Deeper Aspect of Man's Biggest Problem

This truth is clear then: sin produces death. James 1:15 says, sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death. The cause and effect is in this order: sin is the cause, and death is the effect. In Genesis 2:17, God told Adam and Eve that in the very day they would eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, they would surely die. Their sin would result in death. Of course, the kind of death Adam and Eve experienced on that day was not physical, but spiritual. Physical death would come later as a natural consequence of spiritual death.


This points to the deeper aspect of man's biggest problem: man is not just going to die physically, he is dead spiritually. This was evidence in at least two ways right after Adam and Eve sinned. First, they were immediately conscious that they were naked. It is clear that they felt guilty about this because they attempted to cover themselves and hide this embarrassing condition with aprons of fig leaves.

Secondly, when God came into the garden to fellowship with Adam and Eve, they hid themselves. Adam's testimony about this is interesting. He says that even though he had covered his body with fig leaves, he still felt naked and was afraid to be seen by God.

From this we are to understand that spiritual death is a breach in our relationship with God. Sin removes us from fellowship with God and isolates us from Him. Eternal death is eternal separation from God. Without a resolution to sin, men will not just die physically, but will suffer a conscious eternity of torment in being separated from the presence of God (Luke 13:27-28).

The Equation


If sin produces death, what then produces life? If we were to view this in a form similar to an equation, life would be the alternative to death, but what would be the alternative to sin? For example,



The Bible teaches that righteousness produces life. Romans 8:10 says, And if Christ be in you, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness. In this verse, the word

"because" is used twice. It is used once to say that sin is the cause of death. It is used the second time to say that righteousness is the cause of life. Proverbs 10:2 says, Treasures of wickedness profit nothing; but rightousness delivereth from death. Proverbs 11:4 says, Riches profit not in the day of wrath: but righteousness delivereth from death. In Romans Chapter five, there are several statements that address this truth that righteousness produces life. In verse 17 it says that the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ. In verse 18 it says that by the righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life. And in verse 21 it says that as sin hath reigned unto death, even so might grace reign through righteousness unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord.

The equation is very simple. As sin is the thing that produces death, righteousness is the thing that produces life. As sin is the cause of death, righteousness is the cause of life. Therefore, the solution for death is the opposite of sin – righteousness. The equation, therefore, looks like this:



The Reason Man Cannot Overcome Death

Here is the root of the matter: man needs righteousness to overcome death because only righteousness can produce life. The complication is that man does not have any righteousness of his own. Isaiah 64:6 says, But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags. The best we can do as men is the equivalent of filthy rags. Ezekiel 33:12 says emphatically, The righteousness of the righteous shall not deliver him in the day of his transgression...neither shall the righteous be able to live for his righteousness in the day that he sinneth.

This makes the situation critical, because without righteousness we can never live or see God. Matthew 5:8 says, *Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.* And Hebrews 12:14 says, *Follow peace with all men, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord.* It is not difficult to see that being pure in heart and following holiness are connected to righteousness and without these things the Bible tells us plainly that we cannot see God. Psalm 24:3-4 says, *Who shall ascend into the hill of*

the LORD? Or who shall stand in his holy place? He that hath clean hands, and a pure heart; who hath not lifted up his soul unto vanity, nor sworn deceitfully. 1 John 3:10 puts it this way, In this the children of God are manifest, and the children of the devil: whosoever doeth not righteousness is not of God.

Man is not pure in heart and cannot be so on his own. Man does not follow holiness and cannot do so on his own. Man does not possess righteousness and cannot obtain or practice righteousness on his own. So what is man going to do? He must have righteousness in order to overcome sin and death and to have fellowship with God, but man cannot produce righteousness for himself!

The Resolution

God provided the resolution through His Son, Jesus Christ. Romans 5:17 says, For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ. Righteousness can be given to man as a gift. But this gift reigns by Jesus Christ. In other words, righteousness can be given to men only through Jesus Christ. Romans 3:21-22 explains: But now the righteousness of God without the law is manifested, being witnessed by the law and the prophets; Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference. Romans 10:4 expresses it this way, For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.

The wonderful truth is that God accepts our faith in the righteousness of Christ in place of the righteousness we do not have and cannot obtain on our own. Romans 4:5 says, But to him that worketh not, but believeth on him that justifieth the ungodly, his faith is counted for righteousness.

Jesus Christ is righteous. He is called so in 1 John 2:1 where it says if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. Jesus Christ demonstrated His righteousness in what He did for us on the cross. Romans 3:25 says, God sent forth Jesus Christ to be a propitiation through faith in his blood, to declare his righteousness for the remission of sins. Philippians 2:8 explains the substance of this declaration of righteousness in saying that Jesus Christ humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

This humble act of self sacrifice and work of redemption on behalf of mankind is the righteousness of Christ which has the power to overcome sin and death for any man who would believe this to be so and trust in it as a substitute for his own lack of Romans 3:22 says that this righteousness. righteousness of Christ is offered unto all and it is bestowed upon all them that believe. The righteousness of Christ is available to everyone and it is freely given to whosoever will believe. Philippians 3:9 says, And be found in him, not having mine own righteousness, which is of the law, but that which is through the faith of Christ, the righteousness which is of God by faith.

Galatians chapter two is one of the places in the Bible that connects justification with the obtaining of righteousness through faith in Jesus Christ. Verses 16 through 21 tell us this: Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by the faith of Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Jesus Christ, that we might be justified by the faith of Christ, and not by the works of the law, for by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified. But if, while we seek to be justified by Christ, we ourselves also are found sinners, is therefore Christ the minister of sin? God forbid. For if I build again the things which I destroyed, I make myself a transgressor. For I through the law am dead to the law, that I might live unto God. I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. I do not frustrate the grace of God: for if righteousness come by the law, then Christ is dead in vain.

To be justified means to be declared to be righteous. When men stand before a judge, the judge makes a declaration: guilty or not guilty, unrighteous or righteous. If all we have to bring before the Divine Judge is the works of the law, we are doomed because no man can be declared to be righteous by the works of the law. It is absolutely impossible for any man to obey the law flawlessly from his first breath to his last. The consequence of this is noted in James 2:10, For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all. The only way a man can be declared to be righteous is by placing his faith in the righteousness of Jesus Christ.

God has made this wonderful offer to mankind: He has decided that He will accept our faith in the righteousness of Jesus Christ in place of the righteousness which we do not have and cannot obtain on our own. Also, God promises that in exchange for simply trusting in the righteousness of Jesus Christ, He will give the righteousness of Jesus Christ to us. The righteousness of Jesus Christ then produces life in us and we overcome death through faith in Jesus Christ. This is what the Bible refers to as being born again (1 John 3:3,7; 1 Peter 1:23) or regeneration (Titus 3:5).

What a gift! Jesus Christ did all that needs to be done to overcome sin and death for us. On the cross He declared, It is finished! (John 19:30). The only thing left for us men to do is believe and trust in what Jesus Christ has done for us. Romans 4:6 says that the man is blessed unto whom God imputeth righteousness without works. Romans 4:20-25 explain: He [Abraham] staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God; And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform. And therefore it was imputed to him for righteousness. Now it was not written for his sake alone, that it was imputed to him; But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead: Who was delivered for our offences, and was raised again for our justification. The word "impute" means to place into the account of. When any of us believe God as Abraham did and trust in the gospel of Jesus Christ, God deposits Christ's righteousness into our account. This imputed righteousness then produces eternal life. Isaiah 54:17 says, This is the heritage of the servants of the LORD, and their righteousness is of me, saith th LORD. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.

Conclusion

For the person who has believed and trusted in Jesus Christ and through Him received God's gift of righteousness, death becomes a non issue. In the words of Philippians 1:21, to live is Christ, to die is gain. When a believer dies physically, he leaves his body and enters into the presence of God (2 Corinthians 5:8). He is clothed upon with an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens (2 Corinthians 5:1). Jesus said, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live: And whosoever liveth and believeth in me shall never die (John 11:25-26). "Though he were dead" refers to physical death. Jesus says, even though we die physically, we are not really dead because in Him we live in eternity.

At the end of John 11:26, Jesus added a crucial question: *Believest thou this?* It is the question that every person, man woman and child, must answer. Do you believe that in Jesus Christ alone is the solution for sin and for death? If after reading this article you have come to understand the gospel of Jesus Christ and wish to believe in Jesus Christ to receive the gift of His righteousness by faith, then all you need to do is call on the name of the Lord. Acts 2:21 says, *And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved.*

How do you call on the name of the LORD? You address Him by name, make your confession to Him and then ask for the gift of salvation. This is what we call a prayer, and it would go something like this: "Heavenly Father, I confess that I am a sinner and that I can do nothing to overcome sin and death on my own. I believe that Jesus Christ has done all that must be done to overcome sin and death for me. I trust in what Jesus Christ has done for me and I ask you to forgive me for all my sins and to give me the righteousness of Jesus Christ that I might live for ever through Him. In Jesus' Name I pray, Amen."

We can't even imagine being in a storm that lasts for days and days, then reaching shore floating on pieces of a broken boat! But God was faithful to Paul, and Paul was faithful to his Lord, whether on a journey, on a ship, or in prison where he would give his life for the faith he possessed and taught. He "finished his course." May we be able to say the same when God calls us home.

Now we are going to be studying the fruit of the Spirit. For our first lesson, we brought in various types of fruit to see what the kids could identify. They did a good job of identifying them, and they got to taste some they had never had before, like red bananas, sour oranges, and ugli (yes, it's really called that) fruit. We talked about how even though these fruits (plural) don't grow on the same trees, God wants us to have all the fruit (singular) of the Spirit. Caleb became a "tree of fruit" for us. Each week we will take one of the fruit and learn what it means to have that fruit in our lives.

Teen Bible Quizzing on the books of I and II John



We had 8 quizzers this year. There are 3 on a team, so our two teams each team had a substitute.



In the competitions they quiz against 3 teens from another church.







Each chair has a light paddle that the quizzer sits on. The light goes on for the first one who jumps. There are 10 questions in a quiz. They may jump before the question is finished, but then they must finish the question before giving the answer. If the answer is wrong the question then goes to the opposing team with the same seat number. They get 20 points for a correct answer. If the answer is wrong and goes to the other team and they get it right, they get 10 points.







When a quizzer gets 3 correct answers he may no longer jump, and a substitute may be put in their place. Some questions are reference questions where you have to answer according to that particular verse, since a similar thing may be said in a different verse. Some questions are 'quote word perfect', in which only the reference is given, and it has to be quoted exactly as in the text. The material has to be known very precisely.


