At this Thanksgiving time, I want to express my gratitude to those of you who borrow the resources the library makes available to our church family. As a reminder, there are a number of children's books, cassette tapes, CDs, videos, and DVD's which may be of interest to your family as you prepare for Christmas and the celebration of our Savior's birth.

The Necessity of the Virgin Birth

There are two realms of life: the realm of the infinite and the realm of the finite. Only God lives in the realm of the infinite:

He is infinite in existence – He is eternal. He is infinite in knowledge – He is omniscient. He is infinite in power – He is omnipotent He is infinite in space – He is omnipresent. He is infinite in wisdom – He is omnisapient. He is infinite in love – His love is everlasting.

All the attributes of God have the same infinite nature. There are no limits to God in any of His being.

Everything God has created lives in the realm of the finite, including us – human beings. We are limited in a great many ways: in time, in knowledge, in power, in space, in wisdom, etc.

There is a dilemma we face as finite creatures, and this dilemma is a paradox. We are capable of causing a problem with infinite consequences, but totally helpless in resolving the problem. To illustrate, consider: one man with one strike of a match can start a raging forest fire, but that same one man cannot put out a raging forest fire by himself. In the same way, the sin of one man can generate eternal consequences, requiring eternal retribution, but that same one finite man cannot resolve those eternal consequences.

Even before He created man, God observed in His infinite foreknowledge how man would produce these infinite consequences. He saw that Adam and Eve would sin. He saw that Cain would kill Abel. He saw the wickedness of man before the flood. He saw the arrogance of man at the tower of Babel. And, so on.

God was also aware before the foundation of the world that man would be unable to do anything to resolve these infinite consequences. He saw that man's imagination was wicked (Genesis 6:5). He saw that man's heart was desperately wicked (Jeremiah 17:9). And He saw that none would do good (Romans 3:12).

God knew that if the problem of man's sin was

to be resolved, He would have to intervene. But how could God intervene?

The Necessity of the Virgin Birth

In order to intervene and resolve man's sin problem. God would have to enter the realm of the finite and represent humanity Himself. God is the only infinite person there is. He is, therefore, the only one capable of dealing with infinite consequence. But to deal properly with the infinite consequences of man's sin, the infinite God would have to enter the realm of the finite. Philippians 2:6-7 describe the eternal Son of God as being in the form of God, and not thinking it robbery to be equal with God. Thus Jesus Christ, in the realm of the infinite, was equal with God because But then, He made himself of no He is God. reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men, and thus entered the realm of the finite.

How could the infinite God enter into the realm of the finite and become a man? There were several potential problems to overcome in order to do this. First, God could not be perceived as a spirit creature who had merely indwelt a physical form. Christ had to come in the flesh (1 John 4:2-3). Otherwise, His death and resurrection would not have been a real experience. Second, God could not be perceived as an alien from another world who just showed up on planet earth. He had to be "all of one" with humanity (Hebrews 2:11). Otherwise. His death and resurrection would not have been a true representation of the human race. Third, a pre-existing eternal person who had no beginning because He always was had to begin to exist. Jesus clearly existed before He was born of Mary. He declared, Before Abraham was, I am (John 8:58). Jesus prayed to God the father, And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was (John 17:5). The eternal nature of Jesus Christ is illustrated with the background of Melchisedec, who was without father, without mother, without descent, having neither beginning of days, nor end of life (Hebrews 7:3). So before His conception in the womb of Mary, Jesus existed in eternity. But, for human beings, conception is the beginning of their existence. So for Jesus to take on human nature, there had to be a definite beginning, a conception and a birth, just like all other human beings. Fourth, God could not be contaminated with the sin that had ravaged the human race. David confessed, Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me (Psalm

51:5) and Ephesians 2:3 explains that by our very nature, men are sinners. But God cannot sin, or else He ceases to be God. And, if He did sin, He would be an imperfect substitute for the human race, rendered incapable of resolving our sin problem.

The one and only solution to all of this was the virgin birth. In the infinite wisdom of God, He formulated a plan whereby His eternal Son would assume human nature through a miraculous conception which would take place by a work of the Holy Spirit in the womb of a virgin. It was thus more than a miraculous birth. There had been other miraculous births such as Isaac and John the Baptist. This would be a miraculous conception, not achieved by normal human relations as the other miraculous births were, but by a work of the Holy Spirit in the womb of a virgin. Mary affirmed that she was a virgin (Luke 1:34) and the angel Gabriel affirmed that the conception would be a work of the Holy Spirit (Luke 1:35, Matthew 1:20).

The virgin conception of the human nature of the eternal Son of God was without human agency. The Bible states clearly that Joseph did not know Mary until after the birth of Jesus (Matthew 1:25). Jesus did not need to be procreated. He did not need to come into being because He always existed in eternity. He only needed a medium to enter the human race. In the genealogy of Jesus Christ listed in Matthew 1:2-16, in each generation it says the father begat the son: Abraham begat Isaac; and Isaac begat Jacob, etc. But when it comes to verse 16 and the record of Jesus birth, the word begat is not used. It does not say that Jesus was begat by Joseph. It says, And Jacob begat Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus. This is because no human agency was used in the conception of Jesus' human nature. Jesus was the only begotten of God the Father (John 3:16), but not the begat of Joseph. Jesus' human nature was conceived in the womb of the virgin Mary by a miraculous work of the Holy Spirit without human agency.

By this virgin conception, the infinite and eternal Son of God entered the realm of the finite as a real human being. The Bible describes it in this way.

Hebrew 10:5

Wherefore when he cometh into the world, he saith, Sacrifice and offering thou wouldest not, but a body hast thou prepared me:

John 1:14

And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

Isaiah 7:14

Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Matthew 1:23

Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

Galatians 4:4

But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman, made under the law.

Hebrews 2:16

For verily he took not on him the nature of angels; but he took on him the seed of Abraham.

The virgin conception and birth of the eternal Son of God was necessary so that He could take on human nature without being touched by the sin nature of the human race while at the same time He could be the perfect representative of mankind in order to resolve man's sin. Thus the infinite God became a finite man. He was not a phantom. He was not an alien. Though He had a real existence from eternity past, He began to be man when He was miraculously conceived in Mary's womb by an act of the Holy Spirit. He became a real human being — our Brother, yet totally free from sin. And in His work on the cross, He successfully eliminated the infinite consequences of our sin.

The next time you think about the baby in the manger at Christmas time, think about this: God did a very amazing thing in figuring out how to have His infinitely eternal Son enter into the realm of the finite. It was the virgin birth that facilitated this in such a way, that Jesus was able to be as a perfect lamb, bearing our sins in His body on the cross and satisfying the righteous demands of a Holy God with regard to our sins. Apart from this amazing miracle, there would be no salvation. How profound are the words of 1 Timothy 3:16, And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh.

I never get tired of children's sincerity. Their honesty ranges from questions such as, "Am I real?" to prayers like a seven year old girl. She attended 5-Day Club this summer. She received the Lord as her Savior the first day, and the change was apparent throughout the week. Day after day, she came back for counseling and told me about her home life. She wanted to pray for her baby brother who had died. She wanted to tell me about her stepfather's abuse toward her mother. Most importantly though, every day she would ask, "Can I pray for my step-dad?" She would then bow her small head, "God and Jesus? I hope that my step-dad stops hurting my mom. And could you please tell him that you love him even though he doesn't love you? Amen."

Watching her pray for him gives a whole new perspective to Christ's love for us. Romans 5:10 reminds us that when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of His Son. Jesus showed Himself to be the ultimate good Samaritan by loving us when we were His enemies.

Meeting this seven year old girl was just one of the summer highlights. The summer missionaries did an incredible job reaching 697 children in 43 clubs, and saw many make decisions for Christ. The day camp also made a way to reach 216 children and help some of them find their way to God. At the York Fair ministry it was so exciting to see God work. Thank you so much for your support and prayers; you do so much to reach the children.

Mrs. Darcy Cook had guessing games as usual. There were games on paper at the tables for the adults, and all the Sunday School classes had more active, fun games to play out on the grass. The fellowship was a blessing, and the weather was lovely with the rain holding off until after the picnic was over.

Adult Sessions

Missionary Manuel Moyano from Uruguay spoke only Spanish and so for each of his sessions a young man, Daniel Lembeck, interpreted for him. He gave very interesting insight to our conference theme.

Missionary Nang Lyan Kap from Myanmar and Missionary Victor Ho from Hong Kong also spoke in our conference. Nang Lam Cing spoke to the ladies at the Monday luncheon, with her husband interpreting for her.

The conference was different with having translators speaking in a lot of the sessions. It was a good reminder that Christ came to all mankind and wants us to be 'fishers of men' all over the world, to every tongue, people group and language.

Application of the Theme

Part of our decorations included a fishing boat in the front of the sanctuary. People were encouraged throughout the conference to think of one person that God would want them to witness to this year in an effort to bring them to Christ. They were given a 3x5 card to write that person's name on, and put the card in the fishing boat to show their commitment to be a 'fisherman' for that particular 'fish' this year. We are praying for the 'fishermen' to use the best 'bait' in bringing their 'fish' to the Lord for eternal salvation.

Morning Sessions

Monday - Some folks from our congregation took a missions trip to Spain this summer, and they took our first morning session to tell us about that mission field. Each one that went on the trip told something they learned and experienced. This was the first missions trip that Greg and Shirley Beard, and Dawn and Henry Balcom had ever been on and so it was a real eye-opener for them to see first hand the culture and ministry of our missionaries in Spain. Nate Moss had been to Spain before and gave us some history. The group had gone for a work week and were involved in helping with the maintenance of the camp. The ladies had worked in the kitchen at the camp and they made a Spanish dish for us to taste that was very similar to an egg omelet.

Tuesday - The Kaps from Myanmar shared pictures of their ministry. Their region of Myanmar is a bit isolated from the rest of the country. Mr. Kap either walks or uses a motorbike to get to distant villages. He has a well established Bible Institute there that many come to from distances away. Rice was served a special way like they do in the Kaps region of Myanmar.

Wednesday - Manuel Moyano along with his translator, Daniel Lembeck gave us some insight into not only the culture of Uruguay, but also the Jews that he ministers to in particular. God has blessed Manuel with good reception by the Jews, enabling him to have a work among these chosen people. We enjoyed some Jewish Hallah bread with honey and a taste of chicken empanadas.

Junior Missions Conference

During the evening adult sessions the children in grades 1-6 had their own session. They learned the conference theme verse, sang songs, heard from some of the missionaries at the conference, and had a missionary story about a boy in Taiwan. A missionary our church supports is in Hong Kong, and one of the missionaries that spoke at the conference was from Hong Kong, so this story had much in common with what these missionaries deal with in their country, including the culture and idol worship, which was unfamiliar to the children in the Junior Missions Conference. The story contained many illustrations of how to be a "Fisher of Men" and the "bait" that was used to help bring friends and family to Jesus.

The Beginners Class: In September the beginner class began a study of the continents with study of Europe. The children are also learning a song to help them memorize the names of the continents.
