Library News

Our recent Missions Conference sermons which were based on the theme, "Vessels For The Master's Use," served as a reminder that God wants us to make ourselves available to Him every day of our lives. New to the library are several DVDs from **THE TORCHLIGHTERS** series which recount the true-life story of individuals who truly were faithful vessels for their Master's use.

The William Tyndale Story

In 1535, he is being pursued across Europe by King Henry VIII, not because of any crime he committed, but because he is translating the Bible into English for the common people. He has to work in secret, move from town to town to avoid capture, and allude enemies that are lurking around any corner.

The Adoniram and Ann Judson Story

In 1912, this young couple become the first foreign missionaries from the United States. When they are turned away from India, they go to Burma, where professing Christ could mean certain death. Adoniram is thrown into prison by the ruthless king, leaving Ann and their unborn child to wonder if they will ever be reunited or if their Bible translation, the only one of its kind, is lost forever.

The Eric Liddell Story

All of Scotland is eager for their running celebrity to bring home a gold medal in the 100-meter race during the 1924 Olympics. When he makes the decision not to race on Sunday because of his religious convictions, he is labeled a disgrace and traitor, yet God uses this to prepare him for service as a missionary to China during World War II.

The Jim Elliot Story

Since his youth, he had been preparing to share the gospel with those who had never heard. In 1956, as he and four other young American missionary men try to befriend members of the Auca tribe in the jungles of Ecuador, they are mercilessly killed. God uses their tragic death to open doors for some of their family members to share the gospel with this tribe (now Waodani) and become friends with their killers.

ITS ALL ABOUT BEING A FAMILY

Introduction

The family is under such an assault today. It is being subjected to all kinds of characterizations and definitions. Miriam Webster says: "Family is often encountered in legal use, but even within the jargon of the law it is not restricted to a single meaning. In many legal contexts, family denotes 'individuals related by blood, marriage, or adoption,' but in others the definition may be somewhat broader, encompassing groups of individuals not related by these things. (Emphasis mine.)

Michelle Blessing, a Mental Health Professional says: "One definition is 'a fundamental social group in society typically consisting of one or two parents and their children." Another definition is 'Two or more people who share goals and values, have long-term commitments to one another and reside usually in the same dwelling.' In addition to a more universal family definition, there are also plenty of people who consider a group of friends to be family, and adults who consider pets -- from goldfish to horses -- as defining members of the family unit".

They have a term now for people, or animals, you consider to be family to whom you are not actually related by **blood** or **marriage** or **adoption**: it is "fictive kinship". The word "fictive" means you are able to engage in imaginative invention. The word "fictive" is very much related to the word "fiction". To be fictive means you have the ability to make things up. Fictive kinship is imagining people to be family to whom you are not related by **blood**, **marriage** or **adoption**. Fictive kinship is pretending. Like a child pretending to be a fireman or a cowboy, adults pretend to be related to people to whom they are not related by **blood** or **marriage** or **adoption**. They literally call this fictive kinship as if this kind of kinship is real.

But as Christians, we have real spiritual kinship even with people to whom we are not <u>physically</u> related by blood, marriage, or adoption. And we are not pretending.

We are <u>real</u> brothers and sisters in Christ, <u>BECAUSE:</u>

- we are spiritually related by the **blood** of Christ,

- we are spiritually engaged to be **married** to Christ and
- we are spiritually **adopted** into the family of God.

We don't have to pretend, it is real.

And being real, our spiritual family relationship in Christ implies how we are to treat each other within the body of Christ. For the family model in human society is purposely used by God to illustrate our spiritual family relationships in Christ.

I. FROM WHERE DID THE IDEA OF THE FAMILY COME?

In eternity, two members of the Triune Godhead identify themselves by the terms "Father" and "Son".

A. One of God's names is the everlasting Father.

Isaiah 9:6

6and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, <u>The everlasting</u> Father, The Prince of Peace.

The word "everlasting" means "of continuous existence for ever. God is the Everlasting Father because His very existence is in a place called "eternity".

Isaiah 57:15

15 For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place...

Everlasting eternity is a place, and it is the place where God dwells. He inhabits eternity. Thus, God the Father has always been the Father and always will be the Father.

And the Son will bear the Name of the Father because He is the express image of the Father.

Hebrews 1:1-3

- 1 God...
- 2 Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son,
- 3 Who being...the express image of his person,
- B. By virtue of creation, God is the father of us all.

Malachi 2:10

10 <u>Have we not all one father</u>? hath not one God created us?...

C. In that God is an everlasting Father, He has also had a son in eternity.

Proverbs 30:4

4 Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended? who hath gathered the wind in his fists? who hath bound the waters in a garment? who hath established all the ends of the earth? what is his name, and what is his son's name, if thou canst tell?

Acts 13:33 confirms for us that Psalm 2:7 is an Old Testament reference to God's Son, confirming that Jesus Christ was God's Son long before He came to earth.

Psalms 2:7

7 I will declare the decree: the LORD hath said unto me, <u>Thou art my Son</u>; this day have I begotten thee.

Acts 13:33

33 God hath fulfilled the same unto us their children, in that he hath raised up Jesus again; as it is also written in the second psalm, Thou art my Son, this day have I begotten thee.

II. THERE HAS TO BE A REAL FAMILY FOR THE FAMILY TO SERVE AS A MODEL FOR REAL SPIRITUAL RELATIONSHIPS.

A. God ordained mankind to be a reflection of His glory.

God created mankind in His own image. And in His wisdom, God decided to make two people necessary to give a complete picture of His image.

Male and Female Father and Mother Head and Help

Genesis 1:26-27

- 26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.
- 27 So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.

B. Thus, a man is called "father", a woman is called "mother", and their offspring are called "sons" [and daughters] or "children".

By comparison, animals bring forth after their "kind".

Genesis 1:21, 24, 25

21 every living creature ... brought forth **after their kind**,

But man brings forth in his image, after his likeness just like God made us.

Genesis 1:26

26 And God said, Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth.

Genesis 5:1-3

- 1 <u>This is the book of the generations of</u>
 <u>Adam.</u> In the day that God created man, in the likeness of God made he him:
- 2 Male and female created he them; and blessed them, and called their name Adam, in the day when they were created.
- 3 And <u>Adam lived</u> an hundred and thirty years, and begat a son in his own likeness, after his image: and called his name Seth:
- C. Right from the very beginning, Adam acknowledged the terms of family relationships.

Genesis 2:24

- 23 And Adam said, This is now bone of my bones, and flesh of my flesh: she shall be called Woman, because she was taken out of Man.
- 24 Therefore shall a man leave his <u>father</u> and his <u>mother</u>, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

Question

How did Adam know about father and mother? How did Adam know about parentage and children? He wasn't born as a baby. Eve was made out of one of his ribs. He didn't leave his father and mother to cleave to his wife, because Adam did not have an earthly father and mother.

Answer

The only place this knowledge could have come from is from God Himself. God taught Adam the concepts of father and mother. The concept of the family came directly from God. God defined the family. God made the family. And, therefore, no human being has the right to change the definition of the family.

The family by God's definition consists of a father, a mother, sons, and daughters who are all related by **blood**, **marriage**, or **adoption**. It is important to note that God endorses the concept of adoption as a legitimate part of the family definition by using this concept as a model for part of our relationship to Him.

Ephesians 1:5

5 Having predestinated us unto <u>the adoption of</u> <u>children</u> by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,

III. JESUS USES THE FAMILY MODEL TO DESCRIBE REAL SPIRITUAL RELATIONSHIPS.

A. Jesus had a real family on earth.

Mark 3:31

- 31 There came then his brethren and his mother, and, standing without, sent unto him, calling him.
- Mary was Jesus' mother and Jesus was Mary's firsthorn

Luke 2:7

7 And she brought forth her <u>firstborn</u> son, and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger; because there was no room for them in the inn.

Firstborn implies others to follow.

2. Mary had other sons, who were Jesus' brothers.

Note the distinction the Bible makes between Jesus' brothers and his disciples.

John 2:12

12 After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples: and they continued there not many days.

3. And so, Jesus had brothers and sisters in a real earth family relationship.

Galatians 1:19

19 But other of the apostles saw I none, save **James the Lord's brother**.

Mark 6:3

- 3 Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary, the brother of James, and Joses, and of Juda, and Simon? and are not his sisters here with us?
- 4. Joseph was known as Jesus' "father."

Matthew 13:55

55 Is not this the carpenter's son?...

John 6:42

- 42 And they said, Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? ...
- B. Jesus used the occasion of his real earthly family coming to ee Him to use the real human family as a model for real spiritual family relationships.

Mark 3:32-35

- 32 And the multitude sat about him, and they said unto him, Behold, thy mother and thy brethren without seek for thee.
- 33 And he answered them, saying,

Who is my mother, or my brethren?

- 34 And he looked round about on them which sat about him, and said,
 Behold my mother and my brethren!
- 35 For whosoever shall do the will of God, the same is my brother, and my sister, and mother.

Question

What did Jesus mean by doing the will of God?

Answer

It begins with faith in God's Son, Jesus Christ.

John 6:39-40

39 And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.

- 40 And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.
- C. Our real spiritual family relationship is based on the <u>blood</u> of Christ, our betrothal for <u>marriage</u> unto Him, and our <u>adoption</u> into the family of God.
 - 1. The blood of Christ
 - 1 Corinthians 6:120
 - 20 <u>For ye are bought with a price</u>: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's.
 - 1 Peter 1:18-19
 - 18 Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not <u>redeemed</u> with corruptible things,.....
 - 19 But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot:

Ephesians 2:13

- 13 But now in Christ Jesus ye who sometimes were far off are made nigh by the blood of Christ.
- 2. Our Betrothal to Him
- 2 Corinthians 11:2
- 2 For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have <u>espoused</u> you to one husband, that I may present you <u>as a chaste virgin to</u> <u>Christ</u>.
- 3. Adoption

Ephesians 1:5

- 5 Having predestinated us unto the <u>adoption</u> of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,
- D. Being equally bought with the blood of Christ, we are made brothers and sisters in Christ.

There are multiple references to Christians being brethren. In fact, there are 133 verses from Romans to Jude that use this term "brethren" in reference to Christians. And there are also sisters in Christ as Romans 16:1 refers to "Phebe our sister". Note that the word "our" in Romans 16:1 is plural, making Phebe a sister to the whole church.

- E. And so we are instructed to treat each other within the body of Christ as family.
 - 1 Timothy 5:1-2
 - 1 Rebuke not an elder, but intreat him <u>as a</u> father; and the younger men as brethren;
 - 2 The elder women <u>as mothers</u>; the younger <u>as sisters</u>, with all purity.

The key word here is "intreat". This is the same word that is applied to the ministry of the Holy Spirit in our lives and is translated "comforter" (John 14:16; 14:26; 15:26; 16:7).

Intreat means to call to one's side, to speak to, to admonish, to exhort, to entreat, to beseech, to strive to appease by entreaty, to console, to encourage, to strengthen by consolation, to comfort, to instruct, and to teach. All of these are functions in normal family relationships. All of these are things we should do to serve one another in the body of Christ.

Conclusion

So what is implied by family relationships? We often talk about sibling rivalry. And the Bible even seems to address this.

Proverbs 17:17

17 A friend loveth at all times, and a brother is born for adversity.

Proverbs 18:24

24 A man that hath friends must shew himself friendly: and there is a friend that sticketh closer than a brother

But there is something about family ties that bind people together no matter what. I might not get along all the time with my brother, but if you mess with my brother, you are messing with family. And that is a serious matter.

God the Father and God the Son are the real examples about family relationships. Jesus said, *I* and my Father are one (John 10:30). Then Jesus prayed that we would be just like them: And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be one, even as we are one (John 17:22).

The phrase "one another" aptly describes exactly how we should be treating one another within our real spiritual family.

Romans 12:10

Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another

Romans 14:13

Let us not therefore judge one another

Romans 15:7

receive ye one another

Romans 15:14

admonish one another

Romans 16:16

Salute one another

1 Corinthians 16:20; 2 Cor. 13:12; 1 Peter 5:14 *Greet one another*

Galatians 5:13

serve one another

Galatians 5:15

be not consumed one of another

Galatians 5:26

not ... provoking one another

Galatians 6:2

Bear ye one another's burdens

Ephesians 4:2; Colossians 3:13

Forbearing one another

If we would learn to treat each other in the body of Christ in this way, what a wonderful family the church would be!

Solomon tells us in Ecclesiastes that two or more are much better off working together as a unit than any individual would be on his own.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-12

- 9 Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labour.
- 10 For if they fall, the one will lift up his fellow: but woe to him that is alone when he falleth; for he hath not another to help him up.
- 11 Again, if two lie together, then they have heat: but how can one be warm alone?
- 12 And if one prevail against him, two shall withstand him; and a threefold cord is not quickly broken.

We can stand strong in this world if we stand together in our local church, and look out for one another, and see ourselves as we really are in Christ – **FAMILY!**

Junior Missions Conference

When they prayed for a missionary they also got one of their prayer cards to take home along with the special request.

Posters around the church had our missionaries and pictures of their ministry. The children had fun finding the 'vessels' on the pictures that the missionaries use in their ministry.

It was a privilege to have one of the conference missionaries come in each evening and speak to the children on their level about missions. Praise God for elementary children who are willing to learn about missions and have their hearts prepared for future service for our Master.

Missions Conference Report

Theme: Vessels for the Master's Use

Verse: If Timothy 2:21 "...he shall be a vessel unto honor, sanctified, and meet for the Master's use, and prepared unto every good work."

Church Picnic

The Saturday picnic was the kick-off to our Missions Conference with our missionaries present. There was an abundance of food and overwhelming variety. After good fellowship at the tables the missionaries were introduced, and then Donald Kilmer spoke to the adults while Matthew Smith spoke to the children. The rest of the afternoon was spent enjoying games for all the ages. The children and teens had fun playing their games out in the open, exercising their limbs, and enjoying a fun time together.

Morning Sessions

Monday - Donald and Karen Kilmer who minister with the Zulus in South Africa had us taste some Zulu food. It was boiled bread (which they showed us the unique way in making it) and taro root. We learned 'Jesus Loves Me' in Zulu and learned how to make some of the click sounds in the Zulu language. They greet each other differently in South Africa so the Kilmers taught us how to shake hands like a Zulu and taught us to say 'Hello' in Zulu. We did a matching game and tried to match overseas English with American English words. And then of course the reason they are missionaries there is to reach people for Christ. They demonstrated witnessing to a Zulu person and some of the things they might say.

Tuesday - The Matthew and Amanda Smith family ministering in Colombia, South America made Colombian Arepas for people to taste with queso fresco cheese. They used this time to talk about Colombia - it's diversity of geography, history and modern conflict, missionary work in the country, and the need for church planting. Also, they gave us some specific ways to pray for the country. They taught us to sing 'I Have Decided to Follow Jesus' in Spanish as well.

Wednesday - The Moyano family who are from Uruguay, South America and have been ministering there especially to the Jewish population presented their ministry and how the Lord is leading them now to go to Spain to minister to the Jewish people there.

Ladies Luncheon

The ladies really enjoyed the conversations and food at the tables while some faithful men in the church and the missionary men cared for their children in a separate room.

The tables were set with Fall colors and there was a 'vessel' at each place setting since our theme for the conference is "Vessels for the Master's Use". It was a candle holder with a tea light in it. We also want to be 'lights' for our Master.

After the meal, the ladies heard from the two missionary ladies at the conference.

Karen Kilmer explained how we may have preconceived ideas of how God wants to use us, when instead we should be asking God how He wants to use us and be open to stepping outside our comfort zone. Sometimes things happen that we didn't have planned, but we are God's vessel, and we need to trust Him that He allowed it for some reason - to be used to touch others lives and give testimony of God's goodness - be His vessel. She challenged us to <u>look</u> for opportunities to be a vessels for Him as I Corinthians 5:58 says to "...be steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord..."

Amanda Smith gave her life testimony and how even in times with a rebellious heart God always brought her back to Him. She read from Proverbs 3:11-12 "...despise not the chastening of the Lord; neither be weary of His correction; for whom the Lord loveth He correcteth..." She shared how after going to Bible College the Lord allowed her and her husband to help in starting a new church. It was during this time that the Lord put a burden on their hearts for Spanish speaking peoples. They prayed for God to send laborers to these people and soon realized that God was answering by wanting them to be the answer to their own prayer and be missionaries to Colombia.

Missions Conference - Adult Sessions

Don Kilmer's message challenged us to be a **Fit** Vessel. God wants you to be a clean vessel, but first of all you have to be saved. When we have found God's forgiveness then we can share that with others who need it too.

Secondly, you need to be a pure vessel, "sanctified", and depart from iniquity. We need to purge ourselves, and not keep holding onto sin in our lives. Don't let love for self or some sin keep you from service for Christ. There is a battle in the heart to turn from sin to the Lord and be renewed in your spirit.

Third, you need to be prepared, to have a willingness to learn and grow in good works, not showing bitterness or anger. God brings things into our lives so we can touch other lives - be a vessel. Avoid the things that tempt you, and resist it by quoting a verse of Scripture, filling your mind with the Word of God. If you follow righteousness, faith, charity, and peace you will be kept busy for God and be used of Him the way He want to use you.

Matt Smith spoke on the parable of the pounds from Luke 19:11-28. Jesus gave this parable about a week before He was to go to the cross. He gave this parable to clarify for the disciples that his first coming was not about ushering in the kingdom but about seeking and saving that which was lost.

In the parable, while the king was away, he left his servants in charge to be engaged in doing what he had been doing while he was here. Each one was given one pound and each one had the same opportunity.

We all have the Gospel, the Holy Spirit, the same Bible and prayer. We all will give account. In the parable every servant had different results. They were rewarded not for how much they accomplished, but for their faithfulness. The disobedient servant chose to live for himself and lost all reward. All of us have opportunity. But are we utilizing those things God has given us to use?

Spotlight on Tracts




Many people go into debt during the Christmas season.

HOMESCHOOL NEWS

Homeschooling families enjoy getting together to share activities and learn from each other. The parents as well as the children benefit from this interaction. Once a month they share classes together with each of the mothers participating in leading one of the subjects of study or an activity. Another week of the month they go on a field trip that has been set up by one of the mothers. Thus their instruction comes in various forms of mental and physical exercise and hands-on learning.

The youngest class has a playtime and storytime each month.

The beginners class talked about color. They mixed up secondary colors using paint and then used the paints to paint rocks. They also made color wheels. Mrs. Smith helped with art and did some games with a parachute.

The middle class is studying aquatics this year. They discussed the importance of water to animals, plants, and us humans. They visited a stream and surveyed what lived in and near the water. They observed poison ivy and burn hazel which need to be avoided as well as jewel weed which is an antidote for burn hazel. They also identified insects and animals there. They got into the stream and caught minnows and crayfish with nets. At church the children wrote a journal about their experience.

She gave them a picture and told them to write about it. They did a folded story where you can't see the whole thing till the end. Mrs. Brammer took them outside for volleyball and they played two games. They practiced serving, keeping score, rotating, and setting the volleyball.


